This petition is coming before me on this day for hearing in the presence of Thiru.S.Lawrance, Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner and Thiru. K.V.Manoharan, Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and after hearing either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

Petition for bail

The petitioner/A1 has filed this petition under section 483 of BNSS. prays to enlarge him on bail for the alleged offences punishable u/s. 397, 392 of IPC in **Cr.No.2451/2020 of Tiruvannamalai Taluk Police Station. (SC.167/2021)**

Heard both sides. Perused the records.

The Learned Counsel appearing for the Petitioner/Accused contended that the petitioner had not committed in any offence as alleged and he has been falsely implicated in this case and the NBW issued as against the petitioner and the petitioner is in judicial custody from 18.02.2026, and the petitioner is having permanent residence and also ready to abide any condition imposed by this court and hence, prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

The Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State submitted that the SC 167/2021 is pending for trial proceeding and also the warrant pending for over months as against the petitioner, and also 5 more previous cases to the credit of the petitioner. hence opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

Having considered the facts and circumstances of this case, nature of the offence said to have been committed and the period of absconding of the petitioner for over 10 months for appearing before the trial court and thereby causing hindrance to the smooth trial of the case and also considering the fact of difficulties faced by the law enforcing authority to secure the petitioner, 5 more previous cases to the credit of the petitioner, and strong objections raised on the side of prosecution, at this stage, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

In the result, this Bail Petition is dismissed.
