This petition is coming before me on this day for hearing in the presence of Thiru.K.Elumalai, Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioner and Thiru. K.V.Manoharan, Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State and after hearing either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

Petition for bail

The petitioner/Accused has filed this petition under section 482 of BNSS. prays to enlarge him on bail for the alleged offences punishable u/s. 296(b), 117(2), 351(3) of BNS @ 296(b), 117(3), 351(3) of BNS in Cr.No.4/2026 of Vadavanakkambadi Police station.

Heard both sides. Perused the records.

The Learned Counsel appearing for the Petitioner/Accused contended that the petitioner has not committed any offence as alleged and he has been falsely implicated in this case, the petitioner is in judicial custody from 10.03.2026 the petitioner is having permanent residence and also ready to abide any condition imposed by this court and hence, prayed to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

The Learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the State submitted that the petitioner/accused abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and assaulted him and also threatened with dire consequences and the injured admitted on 6.01.2026 and discharged from the hospital on 26.01.2026, and the investigation has not been completed. Hence opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of offence, said to have been committed, and in causing injury said to have been sustained by the petitioner and the period of treatment undergone by the victim for over 20 days , non completion of investigation and strong objection raised on the side of prosecution this Court is not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

In the result, the Bail Petition is dismissed.
