The petition has been filed on behalf of Petitioners/Accused to release him on bail u/s 480 of BNSS.

This application / petition coming before me for final hearing on 10.03.2026. This court has taken up this petition for bail in pursuance of the bail petition filed by Tr.V.Naveenkumar, Learned counsel for the petitioner and the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor, representing for the state, upon perusing the petition and the relevant materials on record and upon hearing both sides arguments, this court passes the following order :

**ORDER**

Heard both sides. Records perused.

The Petitioner is the accused in Crime.No. 40/2026 of Cheyyar PEW Police Station for the alleged offences u/s 4(1)(i) TNP Act, 4(1)(A) TNP Amendment Act 2024. Learned counsel for Petitioner has again filed this petition seeking for grant of bail. The learned counsel for the petitioner contented that the petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner was remanded to Judicial custody on 06.03.2026. The learned counsel also submitted that the petitioner is ready to furnish adequate sureties as directed by this court and assured that the accused would not abscond beyond the jurisdiction of this Court. Hence, the learned counsel prayed for the release of the petitioner on bail.

On the other hand, the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor objected for the grant of bail. Notice was issued to the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor and Sub-Inspector of Cheyyar PEW Police Station They also submitted their reply stating that the prosecution has not completed its investigation and stated that if the present Petitioner/ Accused person is enlarged on bail, then he

would tamper and threaten the witness and also there is possibility of him absconding from the jurisdiction of this court.

The court gave thoughtful considerations to the rival submissions made by both the sides and upon perusal of records and submissions it is manifest that the accused is in judicial custody for about 05 days since his date of remand on 06.03.2026. Considering the period of custody, the material portion of investigation would have been completed by this time. Further, the petitioner has permanent abode and hence there is no flight risk associated with him. Therefore, on considering the aforementioned reasons, completion of material portion of investigation, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

**In the result this bail petition is allowed** and the petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only), with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of this court and on further conditions that :

- (i) The sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and they shall produce a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass book for identity purposes.
- (ii) The Petitioner is ordered to appear and sign before the respondent police station every day at 10.00 A.M. for 15 days without fail.
- (iii) The Petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial and further the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation
- (iv) The Petitioner shall not tamper the evidence or the witness either during investigation or trial.
- (v) The petitioner shall not commit and indulge in any subsequent offence and in case of violation of the said conditions, the police are at liberty to file petition for cancellation of this bail.
