Cri Appeal 855/19	Applicant is absent since many dates. <u>Order -</u> This is the appeal challenging interim order of maintenance vide section 29 of Protection of women from Domestic Violence Act 2005. The appellant and advocate are absent since many dates. Earlier this appeal was dismissed and it was restored in view of order dated 24.07.2025 in MA No. 1269/2024. However, again the appellant has remained absent since last four dates. On perusal of the record, it is evident that Ld. Magistrate after considering the peculiar facts of the present case and material produced before has pleased to pass interim order of maintenance directing the appellant to pay interim monthly maintenance of Rs.15,000/- to the respondent (Original applicant). Magistrate has taken into consideration all the relevant factors for deciding the interim maintenance. On perusal of the record and order passed by the Ld. Magistrate, I do not find any legal or factual error/ illegality in the order passed by the Ld. Magistrate. Order of interim maintenance is quite reasonable and justifiable. It is necessary for the survival of respondent/wife. I do not find any merit in the appeal. Hence, I pass the following order - <u>ORDER</u> 1. Criminal Appeal No. 855 of 2019 stands dismissed. 2. No order as to cost. Judge
