This petition coming before me for hearing, on this day, in the presence of Thiru. P. Savarimuthu, Public Prosecutor for the State and of advocate Tmt. G. Mutulakshmi, for the petitioners and after hearing both sides and considering these necessary materials, this court today passed the following:-

ORDER

It is an application for bail filed u/s.483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.

FIR was registered for the offences u/s.194(3)(iv) of BNSS and subsequently, the sections was altered u/s.103(2) of BNS. The occurrence happened on 04.05.2026. As per reply given by the respondent police, the petitioners are arrayed as A3 and A6 in this case. The petitioners have been in judicial custody from 08.05.2026 and 17.05.2026 onwards, respectively.

According to the learned counsel for the petitioners, the petitioners are innocents and they have not committed any such offence and they have been falsely implicated in the offence and one previous case is pending against the 1st petitioner and no previous case is pending against the 2nd petitioner and hence prays to enlarge the petitioners on bail.

On the other hand, the learned Public Prosecutor contended that it is a case of murder and 2 previous cases are pending against the 1st petitioner and no previous case is pending against the 2nd petitioner and the investigation is at preliminary stage and objected to enlarge the petitioners on bail.

Both side heard. Records perused. On perusal of records would show that it is informed by the defacto complainant that he saw a skull and bones in the land belongs to Prabakaran. On investigation, it was found that there are 6 accused involved in this case and the accused murdered the deceased for money. As per reply given by the respondent police, the petitioners are A3 and A6. Considering the nature and gravity of the offence and the investigation is at preliminary stage, this court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioners at this stage. Hence, the application for bail is dismissed.
