ORDER

1. First bail application has been moved on behalf of accused-applicant under section 482 BNSS in case FIR No.102 dated 23.04.2026, under Sections 85 & 316(2) BNS registered at police station Beas Amritsar.
2. Notice of the bail application was issued to the prosecution and Smt. Rittu Kumar, Addl. P.P. for the State has appeared on behalf of State.
3. The bail application under consideration has been moved on the averments that no offence of any kind has been committed by the accused-applicant. It is contended that marriage of the complainant with son of the accused/applicant was

solemnized in a very simple manner and no such alleged gold ornaments or any alleged other articles were ever entrusted to the present accused/applicant and their family members nor the present accused/applicant ever interfered into the married life of the complainant nor they ever gave any alleged taunts to her. Bachitter Singh husband of the complainant is residing abroad i.e. Canada. Applicant/accused is mother of the husband of the complainant. Accused-applicant is ready to join the investigation as and when required by the police. Learned counsel for the accused-applicants has lastly prayed that accused-applicants may kindly be granted anticipatory bail.

4. On the other hand, learned Addl. PP for the State strongly opposed the bail application of the accused-applicant and prayed for dismissal of the same.

5. I have heard the learned counsel for the applicant-accused and learned Addl.P.P. for the state and have gone through the case file.

6. After giving thoughtful consideration to the respective submissions and after apprising of the record minutely, it transpires the present case has been registered against accused-applicants and their co-accused on the basis of application moved by the complainant before S.P., Amritsar, who in her application has stated that her marriage was got solemnized on 05.03.2025 with Bachittar Singh and at the time of marriage, her parents gave sufficient dowry articles including gold ornaments to her in laws

family. Soon after the marriage, her sisters in laws namely Sandeep Kaur, Simranjit Kaur and her brother in law Sukhpreet Singh started interfering in her matrimonial life. Her in-laws family started demanding more dowry articles, Innova car and cash amount of Rs.10.00 Lacs from her parents. In the month of April, 2025, her parents gave Rs.7.00 Lacs to her in-laws family. On 01.05.2025, her husband left India for Canada and she started residing in her parental house. On 12.01.2026, her in laws family in connivance of her sisters in law turned her out from the matrimonial house and all the istridhan articles are in the custody of her in-laws family.

7. Perusal of the file reveals that applicant-accused is stated to be the mother in law of the complainant. No specific incident with regard to allegations of harassment on account of demand of dowry articles etc has been levelled against the present accused-applicant. As per police record other co-accused have already joined the investigation and recovery has been effected from them. Moreover, applicant/accused is ready to get recover the articles belonging to the complainant and she is ready to join the investigation as and when called by the police.

8. So, in view of above said discussion, it is a fit case where interim bail should be granted. As such, the accused-applicant is directed to appear before the Investigation Officer/SHO of Police Beas, Amritsar and to join the investigation on or before date fixed

and in the event of her arrest, she be admitted on interim bail by the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer/SHO, to her/his satisfaction, subject to the following conditions:-

- 1) that the applicant shall not tamper with the prosecution evidence.
- 2) that the applicant shall join the investigation as and when required by the investigating officer.
- 3) that the applicant shall not leave the country without prior permission of the court.

9. Police record be returned forthwith. Investigating Officer is directed to report on 02.06.2026.
