Petition dated: 15.07.2026 u/s 482 of BNSS praying to grant anticipatory bail to petitioners

This petition coming on this day for hearing before me having the petition filed by the petitioners Counsel M/s M. Soundarapandiyan, , and the State / respondent police represented by the learned Public Prosecutor Thiru.N.R. Sreedharan Babu and upon hearing the arguments of both sides, perusing the reply of the Public Prosecutor for the State/Respondent and perusing the records and material and hearing both sides, this court made the following:-

ORDER

Heard arguments of both side. Records perused. Petition filed u/s 482 of BNSS seeking to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners who apprehend the arrest by the respondent police in Crime No.263/2026 on the file of Ambattur police station registered for the offence u/s 316(2), 318(4) of BNS.

The learned counsel for the petitioners argued that, petitioners are innocents, they have been falsely implicated only due to money dispute over the chit fund, wherein the chit fund of the defacto complainant has already been paid, but wantonly she has filed a false complaint, the petitioners are husband and wife, only since the defacto complainant sought time to repay the demanded amount, hurriedly a false complaint was lodged, the petitioners have no bad antecedents, they are ready to cooperate for investigation and will abide by any condition, therefore prayed for granting the anticipatory bail.

Notice given to concerned police and reply received. The learned Public prosecutor argued that the petitioners are husband and wife and running an unregistered chit, wherein the defacto complainant invested Rs.4 lakhs in the year 2023 for which the petitioners are in due of Rs.6,25,000/- towards her chit amount, but, the petitioners failed to pay the chit amount even after repeated demands, thus, the defacto complainant approached the police, based on the complaint, FIR was registered in Crime No.263/2026 u/s 316(2), 318(4) of BNS, 35 of BNSS notice was issued, but the petitioners did not appear and cooperate for investigation, and the investigation is pending in preliminary stage,

The petitioners state in this petition /affidavit that there is no similar bail petition is pending before any other Court including Hon'ble High Court, Madras and the respondent has also not stated as to pending of any bail petition before Hon'ble High Court, Madras in this case. Hence, this Court considers that there is no impediment to entertain this petition and pass orders on merits.

As per the reply of the learned Public Prosecutor, investigation is pending and the petitioners are not appearing and cooperating the investigation

Therefore, on considering

- (i) Grave of offence
- (ii) Investigation is pending
- (iii) Premature stage,
- (iv) Serious accusation of offence as against the petitioner u/s 318(4) of BNS
- (v) Huge value of the amount allegedly involved, which is not yet recovered,
- (vi) And considering other facts and circumstances,

this Court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner

In the result, this petition is dismissed.
