Petition dated 04.03.2026, Praying to grant bail for the petitioner:-

This bail Petition is coming on this day for hearing before me, filed by the petitioner counsel Thiru. M. Muthamizhan, Advocate with the reply of the learned Assistant public prosecutor or the respondent/police, upon perusing the records, materials and heard both sides, this court made the following...

ORDER

The learned counsel for the petitioner states that he was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 18.02.2026 for alleged offences under sections 126(2), 296(b), 115(2), 351(3) of B.N.S. r/w 4 of TNPHW Act by the respondent police. He is innocent and not connected with any crime. The learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner is under Judicial custody from 18.02.2026 on formal arrest. He is ready to abide any conditions imposed by this court upon his release. Hence this petition may be allowed.

Bail Objection on the side of prosecution/Police

The prosecution submits that the offence committed by the petitioner/Accused was a serious one. It is submitted that the above said case investigation is still

pending. In particular, if accused person is released on bail he may indulge in similar type of offence in future and also will tamper and hamper the investigation.

It is the first bail petition filed by the petitioner who is in Judicial custody from 18.02.2026. The petitioner has been in judicial custody for 20 days. Hence, Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of the offence and period of remand and for interest of justice, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner on following conditions:

1) The Petitioner is ordered to be released on execution of bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties.

2) The Petitioner will appear and sign before the concerned police station daily at 10.30 a.m. for 15 days he shall be available for investigation as and when required by the investigating officer.

3) The Petitioner should not tamper or hamper the witnesses and indulge in any other offences.
