The petition dated 14-7-2026 U/s.480 BNSS praying to enlarge the petitioner on Bail.

This petition coming on this day for hearing before me having filed the petition by the petitioner counsel M/s. Durai raj, Nataraj pillai, Prasanth with the reply of the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor Gr-I for the State/ Respondent, upon Perusing the records and material Both sides Heard this court made the following.

ORDER

The petition is filed u/s 480 BNSS seeking release of the accused on bail. Notice given to concerned police and reply received. The concerned police raised objections to release the petitioner on Bail.

The Petitioner is facing charges **u/s. 296(b), 115(2), 351(3) BNS r/w 4 of TNPHW Act** in Crime No.**248/2026** of T4 Pudur Police Station. The petitioner/Accused is in judicial Custody from 13.07.2026 The Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner/Accused is innocent and did not involve in the alleged offence.

Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor would object on the ground that the investigation is

pending. The Petitioner/Accused may likely to tamper the witness and hamper the investigation. Hence, the Petitioner/Accused released on bail possibility of absconding as well as recurrence of similar crime.

Upon perusal of records it is seen that the petitioner/Accused had been in custody since 13.07.2026. Accused A1 and A2 aged are 26 and 20 years old. Case property is recovered. The alleged offense other than u/s 351(3) of BNS is bailable in nature. Considering the remand period, it appears that substantial part of investigation is completed. The petitioner is a local resident and the Facts and circumstance of the case.

This court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner/Accused on imposing condition that the petitioner/Accused shall execute bond for Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like sum each and from that date on condition to sign before the Respondent **Police Station** daily 10.00 AM for 15 days.

Petitioner shall not hamper the investigation/threaten witness. The Petitioner should not commit the similar offences against in future. If the petitioner failed to comply the above said condition the bail Order stands automatically cancelled.

Accordingly this petition is Allowed.
