Petition dated 27.02.2026 U/s.483 BNSS to grant bail to the petitioner.

This petition is coming on this day for hearing before this court in the presence of Thiru.K.Siva Sakthi Velu, Advocate for the petitioners and Thiru.M.P.K.Maruthappan, Public Prosecutor for the Respondent/complainant and upon hearing both sides, this Court passed the following :

### **ORDER**

The Petitioners/accused were arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 21.02.2026 for the alleged offences punishable under sections 27(2) of Arms Act and 20(b)(ii)(A), 8(c) of NDPS Act registered by the respondent police, seeks bail.

The learned Counsel for the petitioners/accused would submit that these petitioners alone involved in this case and these petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case and this is purely put up case only and the properties were recovered and these petitioners are undergoing incarceration for the past 13 days and prays to grant bail to the petitioners subject to any conditions.

The learned Public Prosecutor would submit that these petitioners alone involved in this case and the allegation against these petitioners is that they were in

possession of 90 grams prohibited Kanja worth about Rs.900/- and both accused are history sheeted rowdy elements and H.S.No.452/2025 and 453/2025 respectively and A1 is having 3 previous cases including SC/ST Atrocities Act and 2 cases are same type and A2 is also having 4 previous cases including SC/ST Atrocities Act and 3 cases are identical in nature and the investigation is not yet completed and strongly objected to release the petitioners on bail.

Heard. Records perused. The submissions of both sides were considered. These petitioners alone involved in this case and the allegation against these petitioners is that they were in possession of 90 grams prohibited Kanja worth about Rs.900/-. Considering the fact that the short period of incarceration of these petitioners and both accused are history sheeted rowdy elements and H.S.No.452/2025 and 453/2025 respectively and A1 is having 3 previous cases including SC/ST Atrocities Act and 2 cases are same type and A2 is also having 4 previous cases including SC/ST Atrocities Act and 3 cases are identical in nature and the investigation is not yet completed and the strong objection submitted by the learned Public Prosecutor and the attitude and the antecedents of these petitioners and other facts and circumstances, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioners/accused.

In the result this petition is dismissed.
