Petition dated 02.03.2026 U/s.483 BNSS to grant bail to the petitioner.

This petition is coming on this day for hearing before this court in the presence of Thiru.N.Mahendiran, Advocate for the Petitioner and Thiru.M.P.K.Maruthappan, Public Prosecutor for the Respondent/complainant and upon hearing both sides, this Court passed the following :

**ORDER**

The Petitioner/accused was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 07.01.2026 for the alleged offences punishable under sections 308(4) @ 191(2), 191(3), 61(2), 308(4) of BNS and section 25(1)(A) of Arms Act registered by the respondent police, seeks bail.

The learned Counsel for the petitioners/accused would submit that the defacto complainant and A1 are brothers and due to civil dispute in partitioning the property backdrop, the whole occurrence taken place and this petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and this is put up case only and no one sustained injury in this case and the complaint has been belatedly given after 27 days by the defacto complainant and in the F.I.R. it is found that two unknown persons involved in the

occurrence and the co-accused in this case has been released on bail by this court and this petitioner is undergoing incarceration for the past 58 days and prays to grant bail to the petitioners subject to any conditions.

The learned Public Prosecutor would submit that totally 5 accused involved in this case and this petitioner being A2 in rank and the allegation against the accused persons is that A1 is the brother of the defacto complainant and due to dispute in partitioning the property backdrop, A1 engaged Goondas to revenge the defacto complainant and A1 along with other accused armed with sickle and waylaid the auto which has driven by the defacto complainant and slit the auto with sickle and the defacto complainant luckily escaped and this petitioner is a history sheeted rowdy element and H.S.No.130/2023 and he is having 9 previous cases including 302-2 cases and 307-2 cases and the investigation in this case is not yet completed and if the petitioner is released on bail he will abscond to other state and tamper the witnesses and hence strongly objected to release the petitioner on bail.

Heard. Records perused. The submissions of both sides were considered. Totally 5 accused involved in this case and this petitioner being A2 in rank and the allegation against the accused persons is that A1 is the brother of the defacto complainant and due to dispute in partitioning the property backdrop, A1 engaged Goondas to revenge the defacto complainant and A1 along with other accused armed with sickle and waylaid the auto which has driven by the defacto complainant and slit the auto with sickle and the defacto complainant luckily escaped. Considering the fact that this petitioner is undergoing incarceration for the past 58 days and no one sustained injury in this case and the co-accused in this case were released on bail by this court and the investigation might have been completed by this time and the antecedents of these petitioners and other facts and circumstances, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners/accused.

In the result this petition is allowed subject to following conditions.

- i) The petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail on executing his bond for Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Alangulam.

- ii) The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the sureties shall produce a copy of their Aadhaar card or Solvency Certificate or Bank pass book to ensure their identity.
- iii) **The petitioner shall report and sign before the Respondent P.S daily once at 10.00 A.M for one month.**
- iv) **The petitioner has to furnish his Mail I.D. and phone number before the trial court at the time of executing bond.**
- v) The petitioner shall make available himself for interrogation as and when required by the investigation Officer.
- vi) The petitioner shall not tamper the witness or hamper the evidence in any manner either during investigation or Trial.
- vii) The petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or Trial.
- viii) That on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the Investigation Officer shall report to the learned Magistrate / Trial Court and shall take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law.
- ix) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered U/S.269 BNS.
