Petition dated 05.03.2026 U/s.482 BNSS to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

This petition is coming on this day for hearing before this court in the presence of **Thiru.M.Elango @ Ganesapandian**, Advocate for the petitioners and **Thiru.M.P.K.Maruthappan**, Public Prosecutor for the Respondent/complainant and upon hearing both sides, this Court passed the following :

**ORDER**

Petitioners/accused seeks anticipatory bail for the alleged offences under Sections 296(b), 115(2) of BNS and section 4 of TNPHW Act registered by the Respondent police.

The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the victim and A.1 are husband and wife and due to matrimonial dispute between them these petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case and these petitioners are only in-laws and A.1 and the victim are living separately and A.1 released on bail by the trial court and the injured in this case was discharged from the hospital and the petitioners are ready to abide any condition and prays to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners

herein.

The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that totally 3 accused petitioners are being A.2,3 and the victim and A.1. are husband and wife due to matrimonial dispute between them and not allowed the victim to live alongwith the petitioner wordy quarrel arose and attacked the victim and caused injuries and the injured in this case was discharged from the hospital and A.1 was released by trial court and Petitioners are in laws and these petitioners have no previous case.

Heard. The submissions of both sides considered. Considering the facts that the injured in this case was discharged from the hospital and these petitioners have no previous case and these petitioners are in-laws and A.1. was released on Judicial Magistrate Court, Alangulam and other facts and circumstances, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

In the result this petition is allowed subject to following conditions.

- i) That in the event of arrest of the petitioners by the Respondent/police or on their surrender before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Alangulam within 15 days from the date of this order and on such arrest or surrender the petitioners are ordered to be enlarged on anticipatory bail on them executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- each (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Alangulam. **If the petitioners/accused are not surrender within 15 days from the date of this order this Anticipatory bail shall stands cancelled automatically:**
- ii) The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the sureties shall produce a copy of their Aadhaar card or Solvency Certificate or Bank pass book to ensure their identity.
- iii) **That the petitioners shall report and sign before the Respondent P.S daily once at 10.00 A.M for one month.**
- iv) **The Petitioners have to furnish their Mail ID and Phone number before the trial court at the time of executing bond.**
- v) The petitioners shall make available themselves for interrogation as and when required by the investigation Officer.
- vi) The petitioners shall not tamper the witness or hamper the evidence in any manner either during investigation or Trial.
- vii) The petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or Trial.
- viii) That on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the Investigation Officer shall report to the learned Magistrate / Trial Court and shall take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law.
- ix) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered U/S.269
