Petition dated 02.06.2026 U/s.483 BNSS to grant bail to the petitioner.

This petition is coming on this day for hearing before this court in the presence of Thiru.R.Stephen, Advocate for the petitioners and Thiru.M.P.K.Maruthappan, Public Prosecutor for the Respondent/complainant and upon hearing both sides, this Court passed the following :

ORDER

The Petitioners/accused were arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 15.05.2026 for the alleged offences punishable under section 305(a) of BNS registered by the respondent police, seeks bail.

The learned Counsel for the petitioners/accused would submit that out of 4 accused persons, these petitioners being A2 and A3 in rank and due to business motive backdrop the whole occurrence taken place and 7 days belatedly the complaint has been given and F.I.R. was registered and these petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case and this is purely put up case only and these petitioners have no previous case and the main accused i.e. A1 was released on bail and these

petitioners are undergoing incarceration for the past 21 days and prays to grant bail to the petitioners subject to any conditions.

The learned Public Prosecutor would submit that totally 4 accused persons involved in this case and these petitioners being A2 and A3 in rank and the allegation against the accused persons is that they committed theft of white pigs belong to the defacto complainant and the total value of the pigs is Rs.30,000/- but, only Rs.15,000/- has been recovered and A2 is having 5 previous cases and A3 is having 1 previous case and the investigation is pending and if the petitioners are released on bail they will commit the same offence again and may abscond and hence strongly objected to release the petitioners on bail.

Heard. Records perused. The submissions of both sides were considered. Totally 4 accused persons involved in this case and these petitioners being A2 and A3 in rank and the allegation against the accused persons is that they committed theft of white pigs belong to the defacto complainant. Considering the fact that these petitioners are undergoing incarceration for the past 21 days and the co-accused in this case was released on bail by the concerned Judicial Magistrate Court and Rs.15,000/- amount has been recovered and the investigation might have been completed by this time and the antecedents of these petitioners and other facts and circumstances of this case, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners/accused.

In the result this petition is allowed subject to following conditions

- I) The petitioners are ordered to be enlarged on bail on executing their bond for Rs.10,000/- each (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Tenkasi.
- ii) The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the sureties shall produce a copy of their Aadhaar card or Solvency Certificate or Bank pass book to ensure their identity.
- iii) **That the petitioners shall report and sign before the Respondent P.S daily once at 10.00 A.M for one month.**
- iv) **The Petitioners have to furnish their Mail ID and Phone number before the trial court at the time of executing bond.**
- v) **The petitioners have to deposit a sum of Rs.2,000/- each before the Judicial Magistrate, Tenkasi under the head of Cr.No.220/2026 of respondent P.S., and the said amount has to be kept in Criminal C.D. to**

be decided in trial and without prejudice to their defence before the trial court.

- vi) The petitioners shall make available themselves for interrogation as and when required by the investigation Officer.
- vii) The petitioners shall not tamper the witness or hamper the evidence in any manner either during investigation or trial.
- viii) The petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or Trial.
- ix) That on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the Investigation Officer shall report to the learned Magistrate / Trial Court and shall take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law.
- x) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered U/S.269 BNS.
