ORAL ORDER

Applicant/accused **Ali Ahmed Karimullah Mujahid**, has
filed this second application U/s. 483 of BNSS, 2023, for grant of bail in

Crime No. 413/2026 punishable under Sections 311, 309(6), 352, 3(5) of the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023.

2. Ld. APP and Investigating Officer have filed their say (Exh.4A) and strongly opposed the same. Perused the application and say.

3. FIR shows that, informant Amjad Shaikh lodged report on 21.05.2026 and alleged that on that date at 02.45 p.m. he was present in his shop Chand Bismillah Caterers at that time accused Sonu along with his friend came there and demanded extortion money and on refusal he abused to informant and then assaulted iron rod on the left thigh of informant. Therefore, he lodged report. Then on 24.05.2026 the informant gave supplementary statement and alleged that on 21.05.2026 at 01.30 p.m. the applicant came to his shop and demanded extortion amount of Rs.5000/- per month and threatened to kill him. Hence, applicant came to be arrested.

Submissions of Ld. Advocate of Applicant

4. Ld. Advocate of the applicant submitted that, his arrest is illegal as ground of arrest and reason of arrest mere not communicated to his relatives. He is peaceful, law abiding citizen residing in a given address. He has deep roots in the society and sole bread earner of his family. The Ld. Advocate has further submitted that the applicant is falsely implicated in this crime out of assumptions and presumptions and allegations leveled against applicant are baseless and without any merit.

5. Ld. Advocate further submitted that, the applicant is young, having no concerned with this crime. He is in jail since 21.05.2026 as

his custodial interrogation is not required. Co-accused Soaib is released on bail, therefore, ground of parity is available to applicant. Investigation is completed and charge-sheet is filed, hence, there is change of circumstances. The informant had received only two simple injuries and he is out of danger from injuries. Hence, applicant may kindly be released on bail.

Submissions of Prosecution

6. Ld. APP has submitted that, co-accused Sonu took iron rod from the applicant and assaulted to informant and snatched Rs.7200/- from his pocket, at that time the applicant caught hold the hand of informant. There is possibility of abscond and pressurizing witnesses if the applicant released on bail. He has criminal antecedents. Hence, there is every possibility to pressurize the witness. Investigation is completed and charge-sheet is filed. Thus, sufficient material is available against the applicant. Therefore, Ld. APP has submitted that bail application may kindly be rejected.

Discussion and conclusion

7. Section 483 of BNSS, 2023 provides that, the Hon'ble High Court, or Court of Session, may direct that any person accused of an offence and in custody be released on bail subject to necessary conditions. In case of breach of any condition by the accused, he may be arrested and commit him to custody.

8. Having heard both the sides I have gone through the case papers under the legal guidelines. The other co-accused Soaib was released on bail. Now investigation is completed and charge-sheet is

filed wherein medical certificate of informant shows that he had only two simple injuries. Now the trial will take its own time.

9. Now there is no possibility of pressurizing the witnesses or tempering with the evidence as the charge-sheet is filed. Under such circumstances it would be just and proper to consider the bail application of the applicant. Hence, in the interest of justice following order is passed:

ORDER

1. Bail Application (Exhibit-4) filed by applicant/accused is allowed under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023.

2. Applicant/accused **Ali Ahmed Karimullah Mujahid**, R/o. Room No.12, Tata Nagar Panch Null, Lallu Bhai Road, Near Asain Dairy, Govandi, Mumbai- 400043, be released on regular bail on furnishing P. R. Bond of **Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only)** alongwith one or two sureties in like amount in connection with **C.R. No.413/2026** registered with Deonar Police Station, for the offence punishable under Sections 311, 309(6), 352, 3(5) of the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 on following conditions:

(a) Applicant/accused is directed to attend the trial on each and every date except personal exemption is granted.

(b) Applicant/accused shall not commit similar types of offence.

(c) Applicant/accused and his surety shall provide their respective residential addresses, mobile numbers and email addresses, if any to Investigation Officer. Applicant/accused

shall intimate any such change in address or telephone number and Email ID forthwith.

(d) Applicant/accused shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with facts of case so as to dissuade them from disclosing the facts to Court or any Police Officer and should not tamper with the evidence and prosecution witnesses.

(e) Applicant/accused shall deposit his passport to concerned police station till further order and shall not leave India without prior permission of the Ld. trial court.

(f) Breach of any conditions by the applicant/accused shall result in cancellation of bail.

3. Provisional cash bail of **Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only)** is allowed to applicant/accused for period of four weeks to furnish surety from the date of release.
4. Bail before the Ld. trial court.
5. Bail Application (Exhibit-4) stands disposed off accordingly.
