This petition came up before this Court for hearing moved by Mr. G. Vignesh, Advocate, for the petitioners/accused and Mr. D. Manivannan, Public Prosecutor for the State and upon perusing the petition and reply, this Court passes the following:-

ORDER

This petition had been filed by the petitioners under section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita to grant anticipatory bail with regard to the case in Crime Number 38/2026 of Kottur Police station for the offences punishable under sections 126(2), 296(b), 118(1), 115(2) and 351(3) of BNS Act.

2. According to the petitioners, they are innocent persons and the petitioners are from respectable family and not guilty of any offences as described by the complainant or whatsoever. The case of prosecution is that there arose previous enmity that the petitioners have describe the character of defacto complainant's wife and questioned the same, that the petitioners have wrongfully restrained, filthily scolded, assaulted with Aruval and criminally intimidated the defacto complainant. The petitioners are in no way related to the offence. The respondent police given unnecessary trouble to petitioners' family members. If they had been arrested and will be put to irreparable loss and injury it may not be compensated by any means known

to law. Since the petitioners apprehends arrest in the hands of respondent police and prayed to grant anticipatory bail to petitioners.

3. Whereas the Public Prosecutor had submitted the reply of Respondent / Complainant in which it is stated that the case is under investigation and one accused is secured and other accused are yet to be secured and petitioners has assaulted the injured and injured was discharged from the hospital. If the accused let on bail, they will tamper witnesses, they will involve in similar offence and hence strongly objected to let the accused on bail.

4. Reply received and perused. Heard. Considering that the injured have been discharged from the hospital and considering the nature and gravity of offence and considering other circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant Anticipatory Bail to the petitioners.

5. In the result, this petition is allowed with the following conditions :

- i. The petitioners each shall surrender and execute a bond for a sum of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate No.II, Mannargudi within one month from the date of Order.
- ii. The petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.
- iii. The petitioners shall report before the Inspector of Police, Kottur Police Station daily at 10.00 a.m., for a period of one month from the date of surrender.

- iv. The petitioners shall not tamper with evidence of witnesses either during investigation or trial and if otherwise the Anticipatory Bail granted in favour of petitioners shall stands canceled.
- v. The petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.
- vi. On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners are released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K. Shaji .Vs. State of Kerala ((2005) AIR SCW 5560)
- vii. If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under section 268 BNS.
