This petition came up before this Court for hearing moved by Mr. P. Rajeshkumar, Advocate, for the petitioners/accused and Mr. D. Manivannan, Public Prosecutor for the State and upon perusing the petition and reply, this Court passes the following:-

**ORDER**

This petition had been filed by the petitioners under section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita to grant anticipatory bail with regard to the case in Crime Number 92/2026 of Thiruthuraipoondi Police station for the offence punishable under sections 191(2), 118(1), 324(4), 296(b), 351(3) of BNS and Section 4 of TNPHW Act.

2. According to the petitioners, they are innocent persons and the petitioners from respectable family and not guilty of any offence as described by the complainant or whatsoever. The case of the prosecution that the petitioners have unlawfully assembled, assaulted Wooden Log, Aruval, mischief, filthily scolded, criminally intimidated and harassed the defacto complainant and his family. The petitioners are no way related to the offence. The respondent police given unnecessary trouble to petitioner's family members. If they have been arrested and will be put to irreparable loss and injury it may not be compensated by any means known to law. Since the petitioners apprehends arrest in the hands of respondent police and prayed to grant anticipatory bail to petitioners.

3. Whereas the Public Prosecutor had submitted the reply of Respondent / Complainant in which it is stated that the case is under investigation and two accused are secured and other accused are yet to be secured and the petitioners have assaulted the injured and the injured was discharged from the hospital and four previous cases are pending against the 2<sup>nd</sup> petitioner and one previous case is pending against the 3<sup>rd</sup> petitioner. If the accused let on bail, they will tamper witnesses, they will involve in similar offence and hence strongly objected to let the accused on bail.

4. Reply received and perused. Heard. Considering that the injured has been discharged from the hospital and considering the nature and gravity of offence and considering other circumstance of the case, this Court is inclined to grant Anticipatory Bail to the petitioners.

5. In the result, this petition is allowed with the following conditions :

- i. The petitioners each shall make non-refundable deposit a sum of Rs.1000/- to **The President, Advocate Clerk Association, Thiruthuraipoondi** and proof of payment of the same shall be filed by the petitioner before the Learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruthuraipoondi.
- ii. The petitioners shall surrender and execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Thiruthuraipoondi within one month from the date of Order.

- iii. The petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.
- iv. The petitioners shall report before the Inspector of Police, Thiruthuraipoondi Police Station daily at 10.00 a.m., for a period of one month from the date of surrender.
- v. The petitioners shall not tamper with evidence of witnesses either during investigation or trial and if otherwise the Anticipatory Bail granted in favour of petitioners shall stands canceled.
- vi. The petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.
- vii. On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners are released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K. Shaji .Vs. State of Kerala ( (2005) AIR SCW 5560)
- viii. If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under section 268 BNS.
