This petition came up before this Court for hearing moved by Mr. S.B. Dillibabu, Advocate, for the petitioners/accused and Mr. D. Manivannan, Public Prosecutor for the State and upon perusing the petition and reply, this Court passes the following:-

ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioners under section 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita to grant bail with regard to the case in Crime Number 100/2026 of Needamangalam Police Station for the petition mentioned offences as punishable under sections 4 of TNPHW Act, 109, 115(2), 118(1), 191(2), 191(3), 296(b), 324(4), 351(3) of BNS Act.

2. According to the petitioners, they are remanded to judicial custody on 07.05.2026. They are innocent persons and has not committed any offence as described by the complainant or whatsoever. The case of prosecution is that the petitioners have harassed, attempted to murder, assaulted with Iron Rod, Wooden Log, knife, rioted, filthily scolded, damaged the two wheelers and criminally intimidated the defacto complainant and her village people. The above case is a

false one and it is foisted against the petitioners. An earlier bail application in Criminal Miscellaneous Petition Number 402/2026 was dismissed by the Order of dated 22.05.2026. The investigation could have been completed at this stage and hence seeks to grant bail to the petitioners.

3. Whereas the Public Prosecutor has submitted the reply of Respondent / Complainant in which stated that the case is under investigation and accused are secured and fifty previous cases are pending against the 1st petitioner and also a history sheeter in HS No. 410/2023 dated 13.03.2023. If the accused are let on bail, they will tamper witnesses, they will involve in similar offence and hence strongly objected to let the accused on bail.

4. Reply received and perused. Heard. The petitioners are custody from 07.05.2026 onwards. Considering the nature and gravity of offence and also other facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the 2nd and 3rd petitioners and considering the fifty previous cases are pending against the 1st petitioner and also a history sheeter and considering the strong objection of prosecution and the nature and gravity of offence and also other circumstance of the case, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the 1st petitioner.

5. In the result, this petition is dismissed for 1st petitioner and this petition is allowed for 2nd and 3rd petitioners with the following conditions:

- (i) The 2nd and 3rd petitioners each shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.15,000/- with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the District Munsif-cum-Judicial Magistrate, Needamangalam.
- (ii) The 2nd and 3rd petitioners and the sureties each shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

- (iii) The 2nd and 3rd petitioners shall report before the Inspector of Police, Needamangalam Police Station daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of one month from the date of release.
- (iv) The 2nd and 3rd petitioners shall not tamper with evidence of witnesses either during investigation or trial.
- (v) The 2nd and 3rd petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.
- (vi) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the 2nd and 3rd petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the 2nd and 3rd petitioners are released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme court in P.K. Shaji .Vs. State of Kerala ((2005) AIR SCW 5560)
- (vii) If the 2nd and 3rd petitioners/accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under section 269 BNS.
