This petition is coming before me for hearing today in the presence of Thiru. J.Nareshkumar, learned counsel for the petitioners, the learned Public Prosecutor for the respondent and, considering that there is no representation on the side of the petitioners, this court, delivered the following:

O R D E R

This is a petition for anticipatory bail u/s 482 of BNSS 2023 for the alleged offences u/s 296(b), 115(2), 118(1), 324(3), 351(3) of BNS Act 2023, r/w Sec.4 of TNPHW Act.

2. The petition averments is as that the case was registered on the basis of the false complaint given by the defacto complainant stating that on 28.12.2025 there was a wordy quarrel arose between the petitioners and the defacto complainant due to family dispute which ended in assault. Injured was discharged from the

Hospital. The petitioners are not at all involved in the alleged offences and they are innocent and falsely implicated in this case and that the petitioners are having permanent residence and they are ready to furnish adequate sureties for their due appearance and abide by the conditions likely to be imposed by this court and therefore, seeks for anticipatory bail.

3. The learned Public Prosecutor filed his objections and submitted that totally three accused involved in this case, petitioners are arrayed as A1 and A2 respectively and the injured was discharged from the hospital there is no previous case is pending as against the petitioners and the investigation is going on and he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. No representation on behalf of the petitioners. Heard the Learned Public Prosecutor, who strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioner. Considering there is no representation on the side of petitioners, strong objection placed on the side of the prosecution and the stage of investigation, this court is not inclined to entertain this petition.

5. In the result, this petition is dismissed.
