This petition is coming before me for hearing today in the presence of Thiru. N.Sureshkumar, learned counsel for the petitioner, the learned Public Prosecutor for the respondent and, after hearing both sides, this court, delivered the following:

O R D E R

This is a petition for anticipatory bail u/s 482 of BNSS 2023 for the alleged offences u/s 281, 125, 287 of BNS 2023, r/w 3 of TNPPDL Act, Sec.184 MV Act.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner with support of the petition averments submitted that the above case was registered on the basis of a false complaint given by the defacto complainant stating that a video circulated on social media showed a person riding a Yamaha R1 -5 bearing Reg No. TN 23 DM 0418 in a rash and negligent manner and performing a dangerous fire act on Chennai - Bangalore NH Road near Pallikonda Toll Plaza. This is the 2nd anticipatory bail application. The petitioner is innocent and he is no way connected with the case and there is no previous case as against him and he is ready to furnish sufficient sureties to ensure his regular attendance and abide by any condition imposed by this Court, and prays that the petitioner may be granted bail.

3. The learned Public Prosecutor filed his objection and submitted that there is no previous case is pending against the petitioner, the petitioner involved in a dangerous act of riding the vehicle in a rash and negligent manner and performing a fire stunt in a public place and posted the video as reels on Instagram, which created fear and panic among the public and endangering human life and public safety and the investigation is going on and he strongly opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. Heard both sides. Records perused. On perusal of FIR, it reveals that on 27.01.2026, based on information received from the Social Media Division, Vellore S.P. Office, the respondent police noticed an Instagram video showing the petitioner/accused riding Yamaha R1-5 bearing Reg.No. TN-23-DM-0418 near Pallikonda Toll Plaza in a rash and negligent manner, standing on the seat and performing dangerous fire stunts by pouring petrol into his mouth and endangering public safety. Hence, the present case.

5. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submitted that the petitioner admits that the act of performing the stunt was wrong and expresses remorse for the same and the petitioner undertakes that he will not indulge in such activities in future and seeks bail to the petitioner. On the other hand, the learned Public Prosecutor filed his objection and submitted that there is no previous case against the petitioner and the petitioner performed dangerous stunt in a public place endangering human life and public safety and strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioner. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, nature and gravity of the offence, that granting of anticipatory bail would send wrong signal to society, strong objection on the side of the learned Public Prosecutor, there is no change of circumstances reported from the dismissal of earlier anticipatory bail application and the investigaion is going on and at this stage this court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6. In the result, this petition is dismissed.
