Both the petitions are coming before me for hearing today in the presence of Thiru.J.Mahendrarvarman, learned counsel for the petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.944 of 2026 and of Thiru. K.Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.986 of 2026 and the learned Public Prosecutor for the respondent and, after hearing both sides, this court, delivered the following:

### **C O M M O N O R D E R**

Both the petitions for bail u/s 483 of BNSS 2023 for the alleged offences u/s 296(b), 309(6), 311 of BNS 2023.

2. Both the petitions connected to same Crime Number of Cr.No.44 of 2026 on the file of respondent police, both the petitions are heard together and therefore this common order.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners in all the petitions with support of the petition averments submitted that the petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.944 of 2026 was remanded to judicial custody on 14.02.2026 and he is in custody for the past 45 days and the petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.986 of 2026 was remanded to judicial custody on 13.02.2026 and he is in custody for the past 46 days. The case was registered based on the false complaint given by the defacto complainant. The petitioners are innocent persons and they are having permanent residence and they are ready to furnish sufficient sureties to ensure their regular attendance and abide by any condition imposed by this Court, and prays that the petitioners may be granted bail.

4. On notice, the learned Public Prosecutor filed his objection and submitted there are totally two accused in this case and the petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.944 of 2026 is arrayed as A2 and the petitioner in CrI.M.P.No.986 of 2026 is arrayed as A1 and there are two previous cases are pending against the petitioner/A1 and there is one previous case is pending against the petitioner/A2 and the investigation is going on hence he strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioners.

5. Heard both sides. Records perused. On perusal of FIR, it reveals that on 13.02.2026 at about 02.15 p.m. while the defacto complainant was traveling in a bus from Vellore to Odukkathur, the petitioners abused him and forcibly took him from the bus stop to a nearby place, where they assaulted him with a bottle and robbed his mobile phone and cash of Rs.700/-. Hence, the present case. The learned counsels for the petitioners contended that the petitioners were falsely implicated in this case and considering the incarceration of petitioners, he seeks bail. The learned Public Prosecutor filed his objection and submitted that there are two previous cases are pending against the petitioner/A1 and there is one previous case is pending against the petitioner/A2 and strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioner. Considering the facts and circumstances of the cases and nature and gravity of offence, the period of incarceration of the petitioners, this court is inclined to enlarge the petitioners on bail subject to the following conditions:

6. In the result, both the petitions are allowed:-

(a) The petitioners are ordered to be enlarged on bail on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- each, along with two sureties for the like sum each to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate I, Vellore

(b) The petitioners shall appear and sign before **the Judicial Magistrate III, Tirupathur, twice a day at 10.30 AM and 05.00 PM** on all working days until further orders from the next day of execution of bond before the Magistrate Court;

(c) The petitioners are further directed to appear before the respondent police, as and when required for interrogation, on summon. Thereafter, they can file a modification petition after 30 days of conditions complied.

(d) The sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and produce copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity;

(e) The petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

- (f) The petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;
- (g) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate I, Vellore/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate I, Vellore/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji v. State of Kerala* [(2005) AIR SCW 5560] and;
- (h) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
