Petition filed u/s.483 B.N.S.S. dated 03.03.2026 to release the accused on bail.

This petition is coming on this day before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru.V.Thamizharasan, Advocate for the Petitioner and Thiru.J.Ezhilan, Public Prosecutor (Incharge) for the state, and upon perusing both side contentions, this court delivered the following:

**ORDER**

This petition has been filed by the petitioner u/s.483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking bail for the offences alleged to have been committed by him under sections 138, 310(2), 351(3), 319, 126(2), 127(2), 115(2), 311 of B.N.S. Act.

The learned counsel for the petitioner stated that the case against the petitioner is pending before the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Tindivanam in P.R.C.No.54/2025, and due to non appearance of the petitioner before the trial court, NBW was issued against him 23.02.2026 and on execution of NBW, he was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 27.02.2026 and he is in judicial custody for the past 7 days. The learned counsel further stated that the petitioner is an innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this offence, and the petitioner is having permanent residence and he belongs to respectable family and he would neither abscond nor tamper any witnesses and prays to release him on bail.

The learned Public Prosecutor (I/c) represented that the case was registered against the petitioner in the year 2024 and in this case, investigation completed and final report was filed and case was taken on file by the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Tindivanam as P.R.C.No.54/2025 and totally there are 10 accused involved in this case and this petitioner is A8. Due to non appearance of the petitioner before the trial court, NBW was issued against him on 23.02.2026 and on execution of NBW, the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on

27.02.2026. The learned Public Prosecutor further stated that now the case was committed by the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Tindivanam to this Court yesterday i.e. on 05.03.2026 and next hearing is posted to 25.03.2026 for appearance of accused before this court, and no previous case is pending against the petitioner.

Considered the submissions on both sides and perused the records. It is stated that due to non appearance of the petitioner before the trial court, NBW was issued against him on 23.02.2026 and on execution of NBW, the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody 27.02.2026. It is further stated that now the case was committed by the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Tindivanam to this Court yesterday i.e. on 05.03.2026 and next hearing is posted to 25.03.2026 for appearance of accused before this court, and no previous case is pending against the petitioner. The petitioner is in custody for the past 7 days. Considering these aspects and the period of custody undergone by the petitioner, this court is inclined to allow this petition with the following conditions :-

(a) The petitioner/accused is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.10,000/- with two sureties** for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the **Judicial Magistrate No.I, Tindivanam.**

(b) The petitioner should appear before the **Judicial Magistrate No.I, Tindivanam daily at 10.00 A.M. till 24.03.2026** from the next day of execution of bond before the trial Court, and **on 25.03.2026 at 10.00 A.M. the petitioner should appear before this Court without fail.**

(c) The sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

(d) The petitioner shall not commit any offences of similar nature.

(e) The Petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

(f) The petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

(g) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial court himself/herself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560].

(h) If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under section 269 of BNS.

**Accordingly, this petition is allowed.**
