Petition filed u/s.483 B.N.S.S. dated 04.03.2026 to release the accused on bail.

This petition is coming on this day before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru.S.Basker, Chief Legal Aid Defence Counsel for the Petitioner and Thiru.J.Ezhilan, Public Prosecutor (Incharge) for the State, and upon perusing both side contentions, this court delivered the following :

ORDER

This petition has been filed by the petitioner u/s.483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking bail for the offences alleged to have been committed by him under section 103(1) of B.N.S.

The learned counsel for the petitioner stated that the petitioner has been in judicial custody for the past 94 days from 05.12.2025 onwards. The learned counsel further stated that the petitioner is an innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this offence, and now in this case, investigation completed and final report was filed and case was taken on file as P.R.C.No.20/2026 by the Judicial Magistrate No.II, Villupuram and the same was posted to 13.03.2026, and the petitioner's wife was shifted from Madukarai and settled at Kariyamanickam, Pudhucherry and his daughter is pursuing her studies in Ever Green School, Madukarai and further, the petitioner's family is not migrated to North India as on date, and the petitioner is having permanent residence and he belongs to respectable family and he would neither abscond nor tamper any witnesses and he is ready to abide any condition to be imposed by this court and previous bail applications filed by the petitioner was dismissed by this court in CrI.M.P.No.228/2026 and CrI.M.P.No.758/2026 dated 20.01.2026 and 23.02.2026 respectively and prays to release him on bail.

The learned Public Prosecutor(I/c) represented that incident said to have taken place on 04.12.2025 and FIR was registered on the same day, and there is only one accused was involved in this case. The defacto complainant is the brother of the deceased. The facts of the case is that the accused suspected that the deceased is having illegal intimacy with his wife, hence on the occurrence day, the accused stabbed him with knife on his neck and as a result of which, he sustained grievous injury and died on the spot. The learned Public Prosecutor further stated that now in this case, investigation completed and final report was filed and case was taken on file as P.R.C.No.20/2026 by the Judicial Magistrate No.II, Villupuram and the same was posted to 13.03.2026 and further stated that the petitioner hails from Bihar State and his wife and close relatives are not residing either at TamilNadu or now at Pondicherry, and if the petitioner is released on bail, he may abscond and trial of the case would affect and hence strongly opposed to release the petitioner on bail.

Considered the submissions on both sides and perused the records. It is alleged that on the occurrence day, the accused stabbed on the neck of the complainant's brother with knife and committed murder. The occurrence happened on 04.12.2025 and the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 05.12.2025 and he has been in judicial custody for the past 94 days. It is stated that now in this case, investigation completed and final report was filed and case was taken on file as P.R.C.No.20/2026 by the Judicial Magistrate No.II, Villupuram and the same was posted to 13.03.2026. It is further stated that the petitioner hails from Bihar State and his wife and close relatives are not residing either at TamilNadu or now at Pondicherry, and if the petitioner is released on bail, he may abscond and trial of the case would affect. Considering these aspects and considering the nature and gravity of the offence committed by the petitioner and also the strong objection raised by the learned Public Prosecutor, this court is not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail at this stage. Hence, this application for bail is dismissed.

In the result, this petition is dismissed.
