5. Details of Offence :

Firstly, that on 22.08.2022 at about 13.00 to 13.30 hours, at Khaparkheda, Tal. Saoner, Dist. Nagpur, you accused drove the vehicle bearing registration No. MH-40/BF-0506 on a public way in a manner so rash or negligent as to endanger human life or to be likely to cause hurt or injury to any other person and thereby committed an offence punishable under Section 279 of the Indian Penal Code and within my cognizance.

Secondly, that you accused on the aforesaid date, time & place drove the aforesaid vehicle in public place so rashly or negligently as to endanger human life or the personal safety of others and thereby committed an offence punishable under Section 336 of the Indian Penal Code and within my cognizance.

Judgment on Plead Guilty

The accused is charge-sheeted for the offences punishable under Sections 279 and 336 of the Indian Penal Code. Plea of the accused came to be recorded. He pleaded guilty for the aforesaid offences and submitted the pursis (Exh.03) in that regard.

2. The accused has voluntarily pleaded guilty to offences. The plea of the accused appears to me out of his own volition and without compulsion and without force.

3. The accused has pleaded for leniency in the sentence being an earner of meager salary and shouldering family responsibilities. So, in such scenario sending the accused behind the bars is not justifiable. If the accused is sentence to pay fine, it would be fair enough to meet the ends of justice. In the result, I pass the following order.

:: O R D E R ::

1. The accused namely **Narayan Mulchand Shahu** is convicted for the offences punishable under Section 279 and 336 of the Indian Penal Code vide Section 252 of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
2. The accused is sentenced to pay fine of Rs.1,000/- (One Thousand only) for the offence punishable under Section 279 of the Indian Penal Code. In default of payment of fine accused is sentence to suffer simple imprisonment for 15 days.
3. The accused is sentenced to pay fine of Rs.200/- (Two Hundred only) for the offence punishable under Section 336 of the Indian Penal Code. In default of payment of fine accused is sentence to suffer simple imprisonment for 15 days.
4. All the default sentence shall run concurrently.
