This petition coming on this day before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru.S.Murugan, Advocate for the petitioner and Thiru.S.Thirumalaiappan, Public Prosecutor for the respondent and upon hearing the argument of both sides, this court made the following.

ORDER

It is an application for bail u/s.483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS).

FIR was registered against the petitioner/accused for the offences u/s.296(b), 115(2), 109 of BNS. The occurrence happened on 13-01-2026 and the petitioner is under custody for the past 61 days from 14-01-2026 onwards.

As per FIR, on 13-01-2026 at about 16-30 hours when the defacto complainant was sleeping at Sundarajaperumal temple varanda, situated at Agraharam Street, Sundarapandiam, at that time the petitioner came there and demanded money from the defacto complainant for consuming liquor and when he denied, the petitioner abused him using filthy language, assaulted with hands and kicked on his chest and he fell down caused injuries on his left shoulder and further naked him by pulling his dhoti and kicked on his private parte and smoking beedi in which the defacto complainant was kept and in order to kill him put fire on his dresses and put the burned dhoti on the defacto complainant and thereby caused burnt injuries on him.

According to the learned counsel for the petitioner, the petitioner is innocent and he has not committed any such offence and prays to enlarge the petitioner on bail. On the other hand, the learned Public Prosecutor contended that if the petitioner is released on bail he would commit similar types of offences again and hence he objected to grant bail to the petitioner.

Heard both sides. Records perused. On perusal of records would show that it is a case of attempted to murder by putting fire on the victim and the victim got treatment 47 days as inpatient and there after discharged and he is under custody for the past 61 days and the offence committed by the petitioner u/s.307 of IPC and without any motive this occurrence has been happened. In such circumstances, considering the long period of custody, the victim discharged from the hospital and the offence which happened without any motive, hence, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with the following conditions

Accordingly the petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on the following terms:-

i) The petitioner shall execute a personal bond for Rs.10,000/- with two sureties for the likesum each to the satisfaction of Judicial Magistrate No.II, Srivilliputtur.

ii) The petitioner /accused shall appear before the respondent PS, everyday at 6-00 pm until further orders.

iii) The petitioner shall not abscond either during the investigation or trial, that the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

iv) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the Judicial Magistrate is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala (2005) AIR SCW 5560.
