This petition coming on this day before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru.S.John, Advocate for the petitioner and Thiru.S.Thirumalaiappan, Public Prosecutor for the respondent and upon hearing the argument of both sides, this court made the following

ORDER

It is an application for anticipatory bail u/s.482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS).

FIR was registered against the petitioner/accused for the offence u/s.296(b), 118(1), 351(3) of BNS. The occurrence happened on 25-05-2026.

As per FIR, the defacto complainant is the Secretary of Illathu Pillaimar Committee and that on 23-05-2026 the petitioner gave a complaint in respect of a shop situated at commercial complex, situated at Rajapalayam. In continuation to that on 25-05-2026 the petitioner threatened the defacto complainant by stating that he gave a complainant for his business needs in the commercial complex shop, if the defacto complainant is not co-operated with him, he would assault him and further threatened to kill him.

The learned counsel for the petitioner contended that the petitioner is an innocent and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and hence anticipatory bail may be granted to the petitioner on any condition. On the other hand, the learned P.P raised objection to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner on the ground that if the petitioner is granted anticipatory bail he would commit similar types of offences again and hence he objected to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Heard both sides. Records perused. On perusal of the records would show that it is a case of abusing, assaulting and threatening. The learned P.P. strongly opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the injured sustained only simple injury and the injured discharged from the hospital. Considering that no serious offence registered against the petitioner and except u/s.351(3) of BNS the other offences are bailable and the injured discharged from the hospital, hence, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with conditions.

Accordingly the petition is allowed and the petitioner/accused shall be released on bail in the event of his arrest or on appearance before the Judicial Magistrate, Rajapalayam, within two weeks on the following terms:-

i) The petitioner shall execute a personal bond for Rs.10,000/- with two sureties for the likesum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Rajapalayam.

ii) The petitioner/accused shall appear before the respondent PS everyday at 6-00 pm for 30 days.

iii) The petitioner shall not abscond either during the investigation or trial, that the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

iv) The petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation by a Police Officer as and when required.

v) The petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any Police Officer.

vi) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the Judicial Magistrate is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate herself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala (2005) AIR SCW 5560.
