O R D E R

1. The petitioner has filed this petition under Section 13(3) of Karnataka Registration of Births and Deaths Act 1969 for entering his date of birth in the register maintained by the office of the respondent.

2. In the petition it is stated that the petitioner by name **Syed Sultan** was born on **30.04.2005** in Bengaluru. The birth event of his was not entered in the register maintained by the respondent in their office. He needs his birth certificate for future purpose. He submitted an application to respondent for issuing birth certificate for which respondent issued a non-availability certificate. For the reasons stated supra he prays to allow the petition.

3. The notice was issued to the respondent and same was duly served but respondent remained absent before the court and placed ex parte. Thereafter the case was posted for evidence. The petitioner has got examined himself as PW1 and in his oral evidence has reiterated petition averments and got marked Ex.P1 and Ex.P2.

4. Heard the arguments and perused the petition.

5. The points that would arise for my consideration are;

Point No.1: Whether the petition is
deserved to be allowed ?

Point No.2: What order?

6. My findings to the above points are as here
under;

Point No.1: In the Affirmative.

Point No.2: As per the final **order** for the following;

7. **Point No.1:-** The petitioner has stated that, he was born on 30.04.2005. He approached the respondent for availing the birth certificate but respondent gave an endorsement that the event of birth of his is not entered in the register and issued non-availability certificate at Ex.P1. Since the respondent placed exparte, the averments of the petition, evidence of PW1 and documentary evidence at Ex.P1 and Ex.P2 are remained unchallenged. **Ex.P2** notarized copy Study Certificate discloses that the date of birth of petitioner is **30.04.2005** and there are no grounds to disbelieve the case of the petitioner. The very object of the Karnataka Registration of Birth and Death Act 1969 is to enter the registration of births and deaths in the concerned

register. Therefore, the **point No.1** is answered in the **Affirmative**.

8. **Point No.2**:- In view of my findings to the point No.1, I proceed to pass the following;

O R D E R

The petition is **allowed**.

The respondent is hereby directed to enter the date of birth of petitioner by name **Syed Sultan S/o Syed Nayaz and Naseema Banu**, as he was born on **30.04.2005**, in the concerned register and issue birth certificate accordingly on collecting necessary late fee.
