**ORDER**

1) The petitioners filed this petition under Section 144(1) of the BNSS, seeking maintenance of Rs.50,000/- from the respondent/husband and father. It is stated in the affidavit of the first petitioner that the second petitioner, a minor child, is studying in VIII Standard and the third petitioner, also a minor child, is studying in II Standard in a private school. The third term school fees for the second minor petitioner is Rs.28,000/- and for the third minor petitioner is Rs.25,000/-. Apart from this, a school van fee of Rs.1,200/- per month is to be paid for each child. It is further stated that the respondent is running a studio business at Kovilpatti and earning about Rs.1,00,000/- per month.

2) The respondent filed a counter denying the averments in the petition and stated that he has filed a petition for restitution of conjugal rights before the Hon'ble Sub Court, Kovilpatti in H.O.M.P. No.217 of 2025. He further stated that he has borrowed Rs.3,00,000/- from a bank and is unable to repay the same. According to him, since the first petitioner deserted him, he is unable to concentrate on his work, and therefore prayed for dismissal of the petition.

3) The 1st petitioner, the respondent present along with their counsel. Heard both sides. Records have been perused.

4) Today, the case was posted for cross-examination of P.W.1. The counsel for the respondent was not ready to cross-examine and sought time. This case has been pending for



nearly 9 months. It is admitted by the first petitioner that she is working in a school and earning Rs.10,000/- per month.

5) Considering the above facts, the educational expenses of the minor children, the admitted income of the first petitioner, the status of the parties, and the prolonged pendency of the matter, this Court is inclined to grant interim maintenance.

6) Accordingly, the petition is partly allowed.

- a) The respondent is directed to pay a sum of Rs.6,000/- per month towards maintenance for the two minor children (Rs.3,000/- x 2 = Rs.6,000/-) by way of interim maintenance.
- b) The said amount shall be paid on or before the 10th day of every English calendar month, until further orders or disposal of the main petition.
- c) No cost.
