Order

It has been further submitted that as per FIR dated 02.01.2022 lodged against applicants/accused and one other stating therein that the informant Nanhe son of Bahoranlal is a resident of village Ramnagar and tehsil Amla district Bareilly who feeds his family by farming. The informant was sitting at his home after cleaning the drain in front of his house. On 02.01.2022 at 07.00 am when Mohan and Umesh, residents of Ramnagar police station and tehsil Amla district Bareilly, entered the informant's house and started abusing the informant with filthy language. When the informant refused to abuse, the above mentioned people started beating the informant with lathi-danda and bricks, due to which the informant hit the brick which hit the informant's temple, causing injury to the informant's head and teeth. The informant is a poor person. The above mentioned people (opponents) are people of domineering nature and the above mentioned people have beaten the informant badly. On hearing the cries of the informant, many people from the neighbourhood came and rescued the informant from the clutches of the opponents and the said people ran away threatening to kill the informant.

Referring the above it has been submitted by the learned counsel for the applicants that the applicants/accused have been falsely implicated in this case, as they are absolutely innocent. Applicants/accused have no criminal history to their credit. Accordingly, prayed to grant bail.

Learned SPP (SC/ST Act) and the learned counsel of the complainant opposed the bail stating therein that sections imposed against the applicants/accused are of serious in nature. Accordingly, prayed to reject the bail.

Heard the learned counsels and perused the record.

Charge-sheet has already been filed. There is no convicted criminal history of applicants/accused adduced. Applicants/accused have not misused the liberty of interim bail. Considering the submissions made by the counsels and looking

into the status of case, gravity of offence, complicity of accused etc., without going into the merit, I deem it a fit case for bail.

In the light of Hon'ble Court's direction given in Smt. Bacchi Devi v. State of U.P. and Another, [2025 SCC OnLine All 5286], applicants/accused Mohan and Ranjeet be released on bail on their executing a personal bond of Rs. 25,000/- each (Twenty Five thousand only) and one surety each in the like amount.
