This petition is filed on 20.04.2026 and coming up for final hearing before me on today in the presence of Tr.S.Selvarathinam counsel for the Petitioner and Thiru.P.Thangeswaran, Special Public Prosecutor on behalf of the respondent/complainant and upon hearing both side and having stood over for consideration till this day, this court delivers the following....

ORDER

1) The Petition filed U/s. 37 of NDPS Act praying to release the petitioner on bail for the offences U/s. 8(c) r/w 20(b) (ii) (B), 25, 29(1) of NDPS Act 1985.

2) The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner has been charged with offences U/s. 8(c) r/w 20(b) (ii) (B), 25, 29(1) of NDPS Act 1985 for alleged joint possession of 11 kgs of ganja and he is remanded on 18.02.2026 he is in judicial custody for the past 69 days. He would further submit that the petitioner/accused name was falsely implicated in this case and the petitioner is innocent and he has not committed any offence, hence prays to enlarge on bail.

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3) The learned Special Public Prosecutor would submit that the petitioner detained under Goondas Act and two following previous cases are pending against the accused person

I) Cr.No. 593/19 of Tenkasi P.S. U/s279, 304(A) of IPC

ii)Cr.No.277/21 of Ambasamudiram P.S. U/s. 269 of IPC and if the petitioner is enlarged on bail, he will commit the same kind of offence and the investigation is not yet completed, hence strongly opposes to allow this application.

4) After hearing the both sides this court is of the view that the Detention order has been passed by the District Collector and District Magistrate in Tenkasi District vide in order No.35/26 dated : 06.03.2026 against the petitioner and further considering the previous criminal antecedents of this petitioner, hence this court is not inclined to allow this application.

5) **In the result the petition is Dismissed.**
