The cognizance of the offence is already taken by the Virtual Court and a fine was proposed for summary disposal of case as per section 208 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988. The violator has exercised option to contest the challan on web portal of virtual traffic courts and the challan is transferred to this court for further adjudication as per law.

At this stage, accusation **U/s 119/177/66(1)/192 A of M.V. Act** explained to the violator in his vernacular language.
