Instant application, praying for anticipatory bail under Section 482 of BNSS, supported with affidavit, has been moved by applicant-accused **Meenu Vishwakarma** in Crime Number and Sections mentioned above.

In a nutshell, Prosecution Case is that Neeraj Bala has alleged that Meenu Vishwakarma who runs a micro finance company at her residence who gives money by defrauding several women and provided money to informant and charged interest and does fraud of many kinds, she alleged against informant's husband that he sent obscene photos to her and threatened to force her daughter to made obscene behavior and made her sign on stamp paper and forced to sign on 15-20 other papers alongwith cheques. She took Rs. 7 Lakh at 10-30% interest by blackmailing her and made finance fraud and when interest holders pressurized informant then she gave her signed cheques to them. When informant tried to commit suicide, her landlady and her daughter stopped her wherein her husband complaint on Dial 100. She further alleged Meenu Vishwakarma has also done fraud with HDFC.

Heard learned counsel for applicant-accused and learned D.G.C (Criminal) for State and perused material available on record.

Learned counsel for applicant-accused has submitted that applicant is innocent, she has committed no offence and has been falsely implicated. Informant and her husband tortured applicant due to which she lodged a complaint in the Court vide Complaint Case No. 1128/2018, Meenu Vishwakarma *Versus* Neeraj Bala wherein a writ petition was filed in Hon'ble High Court viz Misc. Bench No. 5650/2019. Charge-sheet has already been filed in this case. Applicant is apprehending her arrest. NBW has been issued against applicant. Alleged offence entails punishment of less than seven years. Applicant has no previous criminal history.

Per contra, learned ADGC (Crl.) for State has submitted that having found plausible evidences, charge-sheet has already been filed under Section 419, 420, 506, 504 and 406 of IPC against accused/applicant.

Perusal of record reveals that accused/applicant was running a

micro finance company at her residence wherein took Rs. 7 Lakh from informant and made informant to sign on stamp paper and several cheques. It is further alleged that accused/applicant defrauded informant and threatened to force her daughter to made obscene behavior and falsely implicate her and her husband in false case. Alleged offence entails punishment of less than or upto seven years. No previous criminal history of applicant has been brought to the notice of this Court.

After hearing learned counsels for parties at length, considering the facts and circumstances of the Case as well as the law propounded by Hon'ble Supreme Court in the authority of **Satender Kumar Antil Versus Central Bureau of Investigation & Anr. [(2022) 10 SCC 51]** (Order dated **21.03.2023** passed in Misc. Application in the said Case) as well as law propounded by Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench in the authority of **Smt. Bacchi Devi Versus State of U.P. and Anr.** (Order dated **12.08.2025** passed in Criminal Misc. Application u/s 528 BNSS Number 6400 of 2025), without commenting on merits of the Case, I find it a fit case for grant of anticipatory bail.

ORDER

Accordingly, anticipatory bail application is **allowed**. In the event of appearance/arrest of applicant-accused in this Case, she shall be released on anticipatory bail, on her furnishing a personal Bond of **Rs. 40,000/-** alongwith one surety in the like amount, to the satisfaction of Court concerned, subject to the following conditions:-

1. Applicant shall cooperate with trial and shall appear before the trial court on or before the next date fixed and execute bonds thereof;
2. She shall not tamper with the evidence(s) and shall neither allure nor intimidate nor influence any of the witness-(es).
3. She shall not seek any unnecessary adjournments and shall remain present, in person, before Court concerned on the dates fixed for opening of the case, framing of charge, and recording of statement under section 313 Cr.P.C.
4. In the event of default of any of the condition mentioned above, the trial court shall be at liberty to cancel the anticipatory bail granted to the applicant.
