These applications praying for anticipatory bail under Section 482 of BNSS, have been moved by the applicants **Vishal Singh**, **Ritik Singh** and **Hemant Verma** in Crime Number and Sections aforementioned. As these aforesaid bail application arise from same case crime number *i.e.* 95/2026, pertaining to P.S. Aliganj, they are disposed of by this common Order.

In a nutshell, Prosecution Case is that on 02.06.2026 at about 11:30 O'Clock when informant Yashraj Singh was heading to University with his friends Jayash, Tripathi, Rajnish Yadav, near New Nagar Nigam Office, few person Salman Khan, Saurabh Yadav, Hemant Verma, Akash Valmiki, Ritik Singh, Vishal Singh with 7-8 others while being armed with rod, danda and 3-4 pistols had laid ambush and attacked at informant party. Informant, Jayash Tripathi and Rajnish Yadav were attacked on their head with butt of pistol as well as sharp-edged weapon, due to which informant became unconscious and sustained grievous injuries. While leaving threats were given that this time they are saved but next time, they would be done to death.

Heard learned counsel for the applicants as well as learned D.G.C (Criminal) and perused material available on record.

Learned counsel for the applicants submitted that bare perusal of impugned first information report reveals that the allegations are levelled collectively against the six named and 7-8 unknown persons. No specific, distinct or individualized role is attributed to the applicant. FIR does not disclose as to which particular injury was allegedly caused by applicant, which weapon was allegedly used and what overt act is committed by applicant during alleged occurrence. Co-accused persons Salman Khan and Akash Kumar Balmiki have already been granted bail in this case vide common Order dated 19.06.2026 passed by this Court in Bail Application (U/S 483 BNSS) Number(s) 3720/2026 and 3783/2026.

Learned D.G.C (Crl.) for State opposed anticipatory bail applications arguing that applicants laid an ambush and attacked at informant as well as his friends, while being armed with rod, danda, sharp-edged weapons and 3-4 pistols with an intention to kill them, due to which the informant became unconscious. Investigation is pending in this Case. So far as the parity sought by applicants from that of bail granted to co-accused Akash Kumar Balmiki and Salman Khan is concerned, it is vehemently argued that applicants have preferred anticipatory bail, parameters of which are totally different from the regular bail under provisions of Section 483 of Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita.

Applicants are named in the first information report as the persons who, on 02.06.2026 at about 11:30 O'Clock, had laid an ambush with co-accused persons Akash Valmiki, Hemant Verma, Vishal Singh alongwith 7-8 unknown person while being armed with the *lathi-danda*, 3-4 pistols and attacked at informant and his associates with an intention to kill them due to which informant and his associates sustained injuries and informant had become unconscious. It is also alleged that while leaving, applicants had threatened to kill the informant in future. In the medico-legal examination reports, Doctor has noted five injuries on the person of Yashraj *alias* Aryan, two injuries on the person of Rajnish Yadav, four injuries on the person of Jayesh Tripathi. Investigation is stated to have been pending in this case. It is well settled that the power to grant anticipatory bail is extra-ordinary and should be exercised sparingly.

Considering the aforesaid facts, after hearing learned counsels for parties at length, gravity and seriousness of the allegations as well as the quantum of punishment prescribed therefor, grounds for anticipatory bail are not found sufficient and as such, these anticipatory bail applications are liable to be rejected.

ORDER

Accordingly, anticipatory bail applications are **rejected**.
