These applications praying for anticipatory bail under Section 482 of BNSS, have been moved by applicants **Raesa Khatun** and **Abdul Aleem** in Crime Number and Sections aforementioned. As these aforesaid bail application arise from same crime number *i.e.* 230/2026, pertaining to P.S. Chinhat, they are being disposed of by this common Order.

In a nutshell, Prosecution Case is that on 02.05.2026 at about 01:30 O'Clock informant Urmila Maurya, District President, Bhartiya Kisan Union had gone to have communication regarding dispute of house of his fellow worker Pankaj Gupta. Illegal occupants of the house Mohd. Aleem and his wife Raesa Khatun attacked at informant party and without entering into any sort of communication, started pelting stones while hurling abuses. In the meantime Aleem and his wife pelted a brick aiming at informant's head with the intention to kill her but informant shifted at that moment due to which, the brick hit on the nail of her foot. Nail of her foot erupted due to

the attack and the muscles therein got broke. Informant is bleeding and is under pain due to the lethal attack made at her by Aleem and his wife.

Heard learned counsel for the applicants as well as learned D.G.C (Criminal) and perused material available on record.

Learned counsel for the applicants submitted that even the medical examination of complainant discloses injuries simple in nature but the same are being deliberately magnified and projected in a serious manner by the complainant with the sole intention to create undue pressure on the applicants. Complainant appears to be habitual in instituting the criminal proceedings in relation to personal disputes and is already facing criminal litigation arising out of Crime Number 136/2019.

Learned D.G.C (Crl.) for State opposed anticipatory bail applications arguing that applicants attacked at informant with a brick with an intention to kill her, when she had reached out to them to have communication with regard to the property dispute of her fellow companion. Investigation of this case is pending.

Allegations against applicants are of attacking, hurling abuses at the informant and pelting brick aiming at informant's head with the intention to kill her while informant had gone to the house of applicants to have the communication regarding property dispute of her fellow companion. As per the site-plan, which is stated to be prepared upon instructions given by informant, place of incident is the disputed property, which is shown to be residence of applicants. As per the medico-legal examination report of the informant, which finds place in CD-4, injuries of informant were opined to be simple in nature. Investigation is pending in this Case. No previous criminal history of applicants is brought to the notice of this Court.

Considering the aforesaid facts, after hearing learned counsels for parties at length, without commenting on merits of the Case, I find it a fit case for anticipatory bail and as such, anticipatory bail applications are liable to be allowed.

ORDER

Accordingly, anticipatory bail applications are **allowed**.

In the event of arrest of applicants **Raesa Khatun** and **Abdul Aleem** in this Case, they shall be released on anticipatory bail, on their furnishing a personal Bond of **Rs. 60,000/-** alongwith a surety in the like amount, to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/arresting authority concerned, subject to the following conditions:-

1. As the investigation is pending in this case, applicants shall appear before Investigating Officer, as and when required by him.
2. They shall not tamper with the evidence(s) and shall neither allure nor intimidate nor influence any of the witness-(es).
3. They shall not leave the country without prior permission of Court concerned.
4. In case of filing of charge-sheet in this case against them, if any, applicants will appear before Trial Court on date fixed and cooperate in trial; shall not seek any of the unnecessary adjournment and shall remain present, in person, before the

Court concerned on dates fixed for opening of case, framing of charge, and recording of their statement.
