CHARGE

I, Ashok Kumar Yadav-I, Sessions Judge, Sonbhadra do hereby charge you Santosh Kumar Dubey, as follows:-

Firstly, that you, on 04.01.2023 at about 01.30 A.M. at village Karari within the local limits of P.S. Robertsganj, District Sonbhadra, committed mischief by fire intending to cause the destruction of straw (Puwal), fertilizer and plastic pipe and grains belonging to complainant, which is ordinarily used as a place for the custody of property and thereby committed an offence punishable under section 436 I.P.C. and within the cognizance of this court.

Secondly, that you, on the said date, time and place, intentionally insulted and thereby gave provocation to complainant Shyam Lal intending that such provocation will cause the said person to break the public peace and thereby committed an offence punishable under section 504 I.P.C. and within the cognizance of this court.

Thirdly, that you, on the said date, time and place, committed criminal intimidation by threatening complainant Shyam Lal to kill and thereby committed an offence punishable under section 506 I.P.C. and within the cognizance of this court.

And I hereby direct that you be tried by this court on the said charges

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ORDER

Case called out. Accused Santosh Kumar Dubey is present on bail along with his learned counsel.

Heard on framing of charge. Learned D.G.C. (Criminal) opened the case and briefly submitted about the evidence and material collected against the accused person and submitted that charges under sections 436, 504, 506 IPC are being made out.

On the other hand, the learned counsel for the accused person submitted that there is nothing on record to suggest that the accused person actually committed any crime and therefore he may be discharged.

Upon consideration of documents available on record and after hearing the submissions of the learned counsel, I am of the opinion from the material available on record that there is ground for presuming that accused person has committed offence punishable under sections 436, 504, 506 IPC. Let charges be framed accordingly.
