1. Notice of petition issued to respondent via speed post received back with report 'refusal'. There is no appearance on behalf of respondent despite calls.
2. Petitioner filed the instant petition u/s 9 of The Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 r/w section 2 (1) (c) of The Commercial Courts Act, 2015 seeking interim relief in the nature of appointment of receiver with direction to take possession of security/vehicle bearing Registration No.UP 23FN 3054 hypothecated with petitioner.
3. Along with the petition, petitioner filed an application u/s 151 CPC seeking ad-interim relief in the nature of *ex parte* appointment of receiver with a direction to take possession of the subject property.
4. The application filed by petitioner along with the petition was allowed on 29.05.2026. Receiver was appointed to take possession of the vehicle.
5. Learned counsel for petitioner submits that in pursuance of order dated 29.05.2026, the vehicle in question has already been repossessed. Let Repossession Kit/report be furnished by petitioner bank within a week.

6. She further submits that in terms of arbitration clause of the agreement executed between the parties, petitioner is in the process of appointment of Arbitrator which shall be done within four weeks from today. She prays to dispose off the petition.

7. In view of above, the instant petition filed by petitioner is disposed off.
