Order No.3 dated 31.03.2026.

This date is fixed for reconciliation in connection with an application under Section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, filed by the petitioners-spouses on **18.07.2025**.

Both the petitioners-spouses are present by filing respective hajira.

The learned lawyers of both the petitioners are present.

Heard both sides on the point of reconciliation. Despite best efforts made, since the reconciliation process failed, on requests of both the petitioners, the instant suit is taken up for hearing.

Heard both sides.

The petitioners have filed their respective affidavit-in-chief and produced the original marriage registration certificate of their marriage. The petitioner no.1. Runu Sain and the petitioner no. 2 Kartick Sain, led evidence as P.W.-1 and P.W.-2 respectively. The original Marriage Registration Certificate of the petitioners is marked by **Ext.1**.

The record is taken up for passing order.

This is a Matrimonial Suit under Section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.

It appears from the evidence of the petitioners as P.W.-1 and P.W.-2 that they got married on **04.03.2013 corresponding to 20th Falgun, 1419 B.S.**, according to the Hindu rites and custom at the house of the petitioner no.1/wife. Afterwards on **18.05.2013 corresponding to 3rd Jaisthya, 1420 B.S.** said marriage has been registered before the Hindu Marriage Registrar Sri Mannan Hossain, Bolpur, District - Birbhum under the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955. After marriage, they resided together as husband and wife within the jurisdiction of this Court and their marriage has been consummated. In their wedlock, on 17.10.2014, one male child namely Arya Sain has been born to them and as per settlement of the petitioners, their son will reside with the opposite party no.2/husband. It appears further that the petitioners have been living separately since

01.03.2024, owing to differences of opinion and as they are not in a position to live together again, and have been living separately for more than one year, they have filed this suit for mutual divorce for betterment of their future life. It appears also that there is no collusion in between them and none has influenced them to dissolve their marital relation. Since the petitioners-spouses have filed this matrimonial suit under Section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, for dissolution of their marital tie for betterment of their future life and they are living separately for more than one year and also there appears not even bleak chance to restore their marital life and since it does not appear that consent was procured by coercion, fraud or misrepresentation, I do not find any impediment but to accept their prayer for a decree of divorce U/s 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.

-: O R D E R :-

That the Matrimonial Suit under Section 13 B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 be and the same is decreed by mutual consent. The marriage between **Runu Sain** and **Kartick Sain**, which was solemnized on **04.03.2013 corresponding to 20th Falgun, 1419 B.S.**, according to the Hindu rites and custom and subsequently registered on **18.05.2013 corresponding to 3rd Jaisthya, 1420 B.S.** under the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, and the marital relationship between them, stand dissolved by a decree of divorce on mutual consent, with effect from this date of order.

Inform the marriage registrar.
