ORDER

1. The instant petition has been filed by the petitioner under Sec.13(3) of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act seeking direction of this Court to the respondent to register the date of birth of the petitioner's son by name Darshan D s/o Dinesh G and Smt.Malathy M as on 10/11/2017 in the concerned birth register.
2. The brief facts of the case of the petitioner are as under:
It is the contention of the petitioner that his son has been born on 10/11/2017 at Bengaluru. It is pleaded that

when the petitioner has approached the respondent for the purpose of getting birth certificate, respondent has not registered date of birth in the concerned register. Therefore, it is required for relevant purposes. Further, the petitioner has filed an application before the respondent for issuing birth extract of his son, but the respondent has issued non-availability certificate on 08/07/2022 stating that birth of petitioner's son named above is not registered in register of births. Hence, the present petition.

3. Though the notice has been served on the respondent, he has not appeared before the Court, hence he has been placed ex-parte.
4. The petitioner in order to prove his case examined himself as P.W.1 and got marked four documents at Ex.P.1 to Ex.P.4 and closed his side.
5. I have heard the learned Counsel for the petitioner.
6. After the perusal of the case the following points would arise for my consideration:
 - 1) Whether the petitioner is entitled for the relief as sought in the petition?
 - 2) What order?
7. My findings on the above points are as follows:

Point No.1: **In the AFFIRMATIVE.**

REASONS

8. **Point No.1:** The petitioner in order to prove his case examined himself as P.W.1 and got marked four documents at Ex.P1 to E.P4. P.W.1 in his evidence has stated that his son has been born on 10/11/2017 at Bengaluru. It is pleaded that when he has approached Birth Registrar for the purpose of getting birth certificate, but respondent has not registered date of birth

in concerned register. It is further contended that he has not informed the date of birth of his son due to un-awareness of the law. Ex.P.1 is the non-availability certificate issued by the respondent wherein it is mentioned that date of birth of petitioner's son is not recorded in concerned register. He has also produced notarised copies of two Aadhar cards which are marked at Ex.P2 to ExP4. The oral and documentary evidence adduced by petitioner is sufficient to hold that his son has born on 10/11/2017. Accordingly, I answer this point in the affirmative.

9. Point No.2: In the result, I proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The petition filed by the petitioner Under Sec. 13(3) of Birth and Death Registration Act, 1969 is hereby allowed.

The respondent is directed to register the date of birth of the petitioner's son by name Darshan D s/o Dinesh G and Smt.Malathy M as on 10/11/2017 at No.8773, Munibyrappa layout, D.J.Halli, Bengaluru-560045 in the concerned birth register and issue birth certificate after collecting the late fee.
