

Jaskaran Singh vs. State of Punjab BA 19-18

Order:-

The present bail application has been moved by the applicant Jaskaran Singh through his counsel for the grant of bail in the above mentioned FIR. This is his first bail application for grant of anticipatory bail.

2. Notice of the said application was given to the respondent. Sh. Ravi Sareen Addl. PP appeared on behalf of State/respondent and opposed the same.

3. Heard. Police record perused.

4. The FIR in question was registered against the present applicant as well as co-accused Karamjit Singh, Baljit Singh and two unknown persons on the statement of Gurpreet Singh son of Kamaljeet Singh. The complainant has stated that on 24.12.2017 some 7-8 persons armed with weapons were sitting on the tractor Swaraj735 and they wrongfully restrained him and Jaskaran Singh inflicted injuries with Kirpan on his head. He raised his left arm in order to ward off the blow but it

landed on his left arm and thereafter, the other co-accused also inflicted injuries on his persons. They took his purse also thinking him to be dead.

5. Applicant Jaskaran Singh has placed on file his birth certificate which mentions his date of birth as 28.01.2001. The said birth certificate was verified by the Investigating Officer who submitted its report and found the birth certificate to be correct. Meaning thereby, the applicant was a minor at the time of occurrence. Therefore, at this stage, without dilating further into the merits of the case applicant Jaskaran Singh is admitted on bail on furnishing of his bail bonds in the sum of Rs.1.00 lac with one surety in the like amount and subject to furnishing of undertaking by his guardian that he will keep the applicant in their custody with the following conditions:

i. the applicant shall be made available as and when required by the investigating agency for interrogation;

ii. the applicant shall not induce, threaten any of the prosecution witness or tamper the evidence of the prosecution in any manner;

iii. the applicant shall not leave the country without prior permission of the Court.

Police record is ordered to be returned and bail application file be consigned to the record room.
