ORDER

1. Present petition has been filed by the petitioner Nahar Singh, for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.191 dated 04.08.2026, under Sections 115 (2), 126 (2), 351 (2), 3 (5), 132, 221 of BNS , registered at Police Station Badali Ala Singh.

2. In brief, the facts of the case are that FIR was registered on the basis of statement of Sukhwinder Singh son of Amrik Singh. It was submitted that he is doing the work of labourer and now is Panchayat

member of the village Rampur. There is a pond in the village and some persons of the village had illegally taken possession of the same. For removing the illegal possession, the Panchayat of the village had written to BDPO Office, Khera and the said office was initiating action had come to the village for removing the illegal possession of the village pond at about 3.00 pm. When the administration tried to demolish the illegal construction of Nahar Singh son of Chanan Singh, then son of Nahar Singh namely Pritpal Singh in connivance with his father Nahar Singh started beating him. Son of Nahar Singh gave fist blows on his lips and jaw and then picked up one stone and threw at him. In order to save himself he raised his left hand and the said stone hit the thumb of his left hand. He again threw another stone which hit on his left shoulder. Nahar Singh also caught hold Devinder Singh Sarpanch of his village and threw him in the street and gave him beatings and also threatened him and abused him. He obstructed the work being carried out by the administration and restrained the administration from demolishing the illegal construction. Nahar Singh had also called some other person whose name he does not now but can identify them. He was rescued by other villagers and administration and thereafter taken to CHC, Khera. Action be taken.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the allegations of giving injuries is against son of the present petitioner and the present petitioner had also disinherited him who is living separate from the petitioner. The petitioner has joined the investigation. Thus, he prayed that the petitioner be granted concession of anticipatory bail.

4. On the other hand, learned Public Prosecutor for the State and learned counsel for the complainant have submitted that the petitioner alongwith his son called some other person, who were wearing Nihang attire and they came at the spot armed with sharp edged weapon and restrained the public servant and Panchayat Officer, who were carrying out the work of demolishing of illegal construction. Thus, keeping in view serious nature of allegations, the petitioner is not entitled to be released on anticipatory bail.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Public Prosecutor for the State, learned counsel for the complainant and have also gone through the record of the present case. Though, the present petitioner is not attributed any injury to the complainant but as per allegations, present petitioner alongwith his son had called some person armed with sharp edged weapons who were wearing Nihang attire, so as to restrain the public servant and officials of Panchayat department from demolishing the illegal construction made in the pond of the village. Thus, keeping in view serious allegations, without commenting on the merits of the case, no ground is made for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner and thus, the present petition for grant of anticipatory bail is dismissed.
