ORDER:

1. This order disposes off bail application of accused described in detail herein above. Accusations leading to the registration of this FIR is that, police party received a secret information that accused **Prince Pruthi** and Gaurav Pruthi are running a Medical store but from the Medical Store they used to sell intoxicant tablets. Accused

Paramjit Singh @ Pamma used to purchase intoxicant tablets from their medical store and thereafter, sell the same in the villages. On 23.05.2020 accused **Paramjit Singh @ Pamma** and **Gourav Pruthi** were arrested and 40,000 intoxicant tablets were recovered from them. It is further case of the prosecution that subsequently, Gaurav Pruthi made a disclosed statement which further led to the recovery of 40000 tablets from the car Warna bearing No. PB-61C-8476. Further on disclosure statement accused **Gurjit Singh** was also apprehended with 4000 intoxicating tablets of Tramadol. Further the tablets recovered in this case as stated above were purchased by the accused from the Medical Store Bhuvi Traders at Sirsa which is owned by **Sahil Sachdeva** son of Rattan Lal. Accused are also having links with drug smugglers. On this, FIR was registered.

2. It is alleged on behalf of accused that accused innocent and not committed any offence and in custody since 22.05.2020.

3. The application was contested by the learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State on the ground that the quantity recovered from the accused falls in the commercial quantity and the bail cannot be granted to the applicant.

4. Appreciating the contentions aforesaid and having

carefully gone through the police record, it is found that in this FIR total 84000/- intoxicant tablets were recovered.

(40000 Tablets, average weight 410.0 mg) (40000 x 410.0 = 16 Kgs. 402 gm) (Tramadol Hydrochloride)

(40000 Tablets, average weight 411.99 mg) (40000 x 411.99 = 16 Kgs. 479 gm) (Tramadol Hydrochloride)

(4000 Tablets, average weight 410.26 mg) (4000 x 410.26 = 1 Kg. 64 gm) (Tramadol Hydrochloride)

The quantity recovered from the applicant/accused falls in the category of commercial quantity. In view of Section 37 of the NDPS Act, 1985 the accused not entitled to bail, bail application is accordingly dismissed.

5. The copy of this order be placed with the remand papers and this file be consigned to the record room.
