This petition coming before me for hearing in the presence of Thiru. Rathinasingham., B.A., B.L., Advocate for the petitioner and the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor, Grade II is on record for the respondent. Upon hearing the arguments and upon perusing connected material records and having stood over till this day for consideration, this Court passed the following

Bail Order

Records perused. The petitioners has come forward with this petition under Section 480 of the new Criminal Procedure Code BNSS. On perusal, of records, it appears that the petitioners / accused has been alleged to have committed offenses under Section. There was remanded on 20.01.2025 and they are in Judicial custody for the past 07 days.

The learned counsel for the petitioners stated in the petition that the petitioner is innocent and has not committed any offense as alleged by the prosecution and the respondent Police have foisted a false case against the petitioner and they are law abiding citizen and has permanent residence and they will not abscond and the investigation in this case is almost over. There are prepared to give necessary sureties to the satisfaction of this Court. There are ready to obey the condition. This Court may be pleased to grant bail to the petitioners.

The respondent strongly objected to release the petitioners on bail as the case is under investigation. Releasing them on bail would hamper further investigation. Further, if the accused are released on bail there are all possibilities that they may repeat such offenses and there is a chance for absconding himself. There are 2 criminal cases pending against the accused No.1 in various police stations.

On perusal of records, this Court finds that the petitioners / accused is in judicial custody for the past 07 days. Considering the nature of accusation against the petitioners and rival submissions, this Court is of the opinion that critical stage of the investigation would not have been completed. This Court is of the view that if the petitioner is enlarged on bail there is a chance for committing similar offence.

In the result, this petition is dismissed.
