Petition dated: 20.03.2025 u/s 483 of BNSS praying to enlarge the petitioner on bail

This petition coming on this day for hearing before me having the petition filed by the petitioners Counsel Tr. G.Selvakumar, Tr.L.Vidhyapathy and the respondent police through the Public Prosecutor, and upon hearing the arguments of both sides, perusing the reply of the Public Prosecutor for the State/Respondent and perusing the records and material and hearing both sides, this court made the following:-

ORDER

Heard arguments on both sides. Records perused. Petition filed u/s 483 of BNSS seeking to release on bail the petitioner who was remanded on 10.03.2025 in Crime No. 7/2025 on the file of Ennore Police station registered for the offence U/s. 5(l), 5(j)(ii) r/w 6 of POCSO Act 2012.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that there is no previous case against the petitioner, it is purely false and fabricated case against the petitioner, he is no way connected with the above said alleged offences.

3. The Special Public prosecutor on the other hand would object stating that the

petitioner would tamper with the witnesses and he would repeat similar offence. It was also submitted that this petition being second bail petition there is no change in circumstances. However, the learned Public Prosecutor would fairly admit that statement of victim has been obtained.

4. Perused records. Considering the period in custody and that statement of victim is obtained and investigation is almost completed, I am inclined to release the petitioner on bail, however on conditions that:

- i) The petitioner/accused shall not abscond or indulge in any similar nature of offences;
- ii) The petitioner shall co-operate for investigation and shall not tamper with any of the witnesses and evidence;
- iii) He shall furnish two sureties of each Rs.10,000/- and he shall sign before the Police Station at 10.30 A.M. and 5.30 P.M. on all days until further orders and violation if any of the above conditions, bail will be cancelled as per the Judgment of the Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs.State of Kerala (AIR 2005 SCW 5560)
