O R D E R

1. This order shall dispose off 2nd bail application moved on
behalf of above said applicant/accused under Section 439 Cr.P.C.

2. Present FIR has been registered on the statement of
complainant Poonam alleging that on 24.01.2021 she was coming to her
house by Auto after discharging his duty at Metro Mall. After reaching
at Milk Plan Verka she came out of the auto and called her husband

Navdeep Sharma on her mobile Samsung to pick her up and then she placed the mobile in the purse and started walking. At 4:30 p.m. two persons came on motorcycle from the side of Milk Plant Verka and snatched her purse comprising of her mobile, Aadhaar card, identity card and other documents and also gave slaps to her and fled towards Railway Station Verka. She raised hue and cry as such both the persons were nabbed by the commuters and in the meantime her husband also came.

3. Notice of the bail application was given to state and record perused.

4. Learned counsel for the applicant argued with the lines of bail application and submitted that no useful purpose will be served by detaining the accused/applicant behind the bars for indefinite time. Thereafter, prayer was made to allow the bail application.

5. Per contra, learned Addl. P.P. for the state argued that there are serious allegations against the applicant/accused and there is every likelihood that if he is granted bail then he would threaten the prosecution witnesses which would prejudice the trial. Thereafter, she prayed for dismissal of bail application.

6. I have heard the rival submissions besides perusing the record.

7. As per record, there are specific allegations against the accused/applicant and there is every likelihood that if the applicant/accused is granted the concession of bail then he would threaten the prosecution witnesses which would prejudice the trial and there are also chances to flee away of the applicant/accused. Keeping in view the nature and gravity of the offence alleged to have been committed by the applicant/accused, this court finds that there is no justification to grant the concession of bail to the applicant/accused. Accordingly, without commenting on merits, the instant bail application deserves dismissal and is hereby dismissed. Record be returned along with the copy of this order. Bail application papers be consigned to the record room.
