

State of Punjab Vs. Kulbir Singh
(FIR No. 100 of 2022, PS Ghanaur)

1. The present order shall dispose off the bail application filed by the applicant / accused Kulbir Singh Singh through counsel for allegedly committing the offence punishable under Section 379 & 411 IPC.

2. The Ld. Counsel for the applicant / accused submitted that the applicant / accused has falsely been implicated in the present case and he has not committed any such offence. Hence, a prayer for releasing the accused / applicant on bail has been made.

3. On the other hand, learned Addl.P.P for the State contested the bail application by way of filing reply and submitted that accused / applicant has committed serious offence and he is not entitled for concession of bail and prayed for the dismissal of the bail application.

4. I have heard Ld. Counsel for the applicant / accused and Ld. APP for the State and have gone through the record carefully.

5. The applicant / accused Kulbir Singh was arrested in the present case on 25-08-2022 and since then he is in judicial custody. The allegations levelled against the applicant / accused are yet to be proved. The alleged recovery has already been effected and nothing is to be recovered from the applicant / accused. The presentation of challan and

thereafter, conclusion of trial would take a long time and no useful purpose will be served by keeping the applicant / accused in custody for indefinite period. Thus, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case, the applicant / accused namely Kulbir Singh is admitted to bail in the present case under Section 379 & 411 of Indian Penal Code, on his furnishing of bail bonds in the sum of Rs. 40,000/- with one surety of the like amount, subject to following conditions:-

- 1) The applicant shall appear in the Court on each and every date of hearing.
- 2) The applicant shall not interfere in the investigation or indulge himself in influencing or threatening the witnesses.
- 3) The applicant shall not leave the territory of India without the prior permission of the Court.

Requisite Bail bonds / surety bonds not furnished.
