Today is fixed for ex-parte argument.

Petitioner is present by filing hazira through Ld. Advocate.

Argument is heard in full.

The record is taken up for passing ex-parte order.

The fact of the case, in a nut-shell, is that the petitioner got married with the respondent as per Hindu rites and customs on 28/01/2012. After marriage, the petitioner went to her matrimonial house and started her conjugal life with the respondent as husband and wife. Due to consummation of marriage the petitioner gave birth to one male child, namely, Priyangshu Das who had been residing alongwith his mother i.e the petitioner. During the said marriage different gift articles like gold ornaments, furnitures, clothes, bedding, utensils etc. were given to the respondent but the family members of the respondent were dissatisfied with the said dowry on account of inferior quality. So, they put pressure upon the petitioner to provide additional dowry to the tune of Rs. 1,00,000/-. Due to failure to pay the additional dowry, the respondent and the in-laws members started to torture the petitioner both physically and mentally. Lastly, on 20/06/2018 the petitioner was driven out from her matrimonial house.

The cause of action of this suit arose on 29/08/2025 when the petitioner was forcibly driven away from her nuptial house after being assaulted therein.

The petitioner, by filing this suit, has prayed for a decree of divorce after dissolution of marriage under section 13(1)(ia) of the Hindu Marriage Act.

The petitioner in order to substantiate the facts and allegation made out in the plaint adduced evidence. The petitioner, Smt. Pallabi Rana Das was examined as PW-1. P.W.-1 deposed by filing affidavit-in-chief in corroboration to the pleading in the plaint. P.W.-2, Sri Prasanta Rana corroborated the evidence given by P.W.-1. Petitioner proved her original marriage certificate and it was marked as exhibit no.1, outdoor prescription be marked as exhibit no.2, injury report be marked as exhibit-3 and two emergency tickets be marked as exhibit-4 and 4/1.

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After perusing the entire unchallenged oral evidence of the petitioner, this Court is of the considered view that the petitioner has successfully proved the ground for divorce as stated in the petition. As a result, the case of the petitioner succeeds ex-parte.

Hence, it is,

Ordered

that the Mat Suit No. 71/2026 be and the same is allowed and decreed ex-parte against the respondent without cost. The marriage solemnized on 28/01/2012 between the petitioner, **Smt. Pallabi Rana Das** and respondent, **Sri Prasanta Kumar Das** stands dissolved by a decree of divorce on and from the date of passing this order as per the provision of section 13(1)(ia) of the Hindu Marriage Act. 1955.
