

**Mat Suit No. 393/25**  
**(C.N.R no.WBHG010033932025)**

Order No. 05 dated 16.04.26

Both the petitioners namely, Moumita Ghosh Mondal and Suman Mandal are present.

The record is taken up for passing order.

On the last date this court interacted with the parties separately and individually to make endeavour to settle and reconcile the dispute between the parties. However, in spite of best effort on the part of the court the reconciliation failed.

Parties have filed and tendered their evidences-in-chief through affidavit and also examined before the Court on oath as P.W.1 and P.W.2 on the last date.

Both the parties have also filed child custody affidavit with respect to their daughter Aishiki Mondal . Both sides have also filed standard parenting plan and an agreement between the parties regarding the welfare of their child Aishiki Mondal in accordance to the standard parenting plan.

Heard Ld. Advocates for both the petitioners.

It appears that the marriage in the petitioner No. 1 and petitioner No. 2 was solemnized on 18.02.2006 according to Hindu Rites and Customs. Thereafter, the parties lived together as husband and wife and the marriage was consummated. One daughter named Aishiki Mondal was born to them out of the marriage. However, the parties have been living separately from 10.03.2018 due to dispute and differences of opinion and incompatibility. The daughter of the parties is residing with the petitioner no. 1. Both parties tried their level best to resolve the dispute and differences but their attempts did not yield any positive result. The petitioners have mutually agreed that the marriage should be dissolved and as such they have approached this Court by filing this case on 22.08.25.

Having regard to Section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act and on the motion of both the parties made today after six months from the date of presentation of the aforesaid case, now it appears to me that the matrimonial tie between the parties has been broken to such an extent that their co-existence is practically impossible and as such I am inclined to pass order accordingly.

In the result, the suit succeeds. C.F paid is correct.

Hence, it is,

**Ordered**

that the Matrimonial Suit be and the same is hereby allowed on mutual consent in terms of the petition U/Sec. 13B of Hindu Marriage Act and the marriage solemnized between the parties Moumita Ghosh Mondal and Suman Mondal on 18.02.2006 stands dissolved by a decree of divorce on mutual consent with effect from this date of order. Decree be drawn accordingly.

A copy of this order and decree be supplied free of cost to both the parties under the provision as envisaged in Section 23(4) of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.
