Order No. 3, dated 16.04.26

Today is fixed for reconciliation.

Both the petitioners namely, Moumita Banerjee and Sauvik Banerjee are present.

The record is taken up for reconciliation and this court interacted with the parties separately and individually to make endeavour to settle and reconcile the dispute between the parties. However, in spite of best effort on the part of the court the reconciliation failed.

Parties have filed and tendered their evidences-in-chief through affidavit and also examined before the Court on oath as P.W.1 and P.W.2 and discharged. The Aadhar card, birth certificate of child is marked as Exbt. 1 and 2 respectively and the Aadhar card of P.W – 2 is marked as Exbt. 3.

Heard Ld. Advocates for both the petitioners.

The record is taken up for passing order.

Perused the documents such as Exhibit-1, Exhibit-2 and Exhibit – 3. respectively and evidence adduced by the parties. Both parties have also submitted parenting plan in respect of the child is kept with the record.

The record is taken up for passing order.

It appears that the marriage in between the petitioner No. 1 and petitioner No. 2 was solemnized on 08.12.2008 according to Hindu Rites and Customs. Thereafter, the parties lived together as husband and wife and the marriage was consummated and a female child was born out of the wedlock. However, since 10.10.2022 the parties have been living separately due to dispute and differences of opinion and incompatibility. The female child is presently residing with the mother i.e the petitioner no. 1. Both parties tried their level best to resolve the dispute and differences but their attempts did not yield any positive result. That the petitioners have mutually agreed that the marriage should be mutually dissolved and as such

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they have approached before this Court by filing this case on 09.09.2025.

Having regard to Section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act and on the motion of both the parties made today after six months from the date of presentation of the aforesaid case, it appears to me that the matrimonial tie between the parties has been broken to such an extent that their co-existence is practically impossible and as such I am inclined to pass order in terms of the prayer made by the petitioners.

As the result, the suit succeeds. C.F paid is correct.

Hence, it is,

Ordered

that the Matrimonial Suit be and the same is hereby allowed on mutual consent in terms of the petition U/Sec. 13B of Hindu Marriage Act and the marriage solemnized between the parties on 08.12.2008 stands dissolved by a decree of divorce on mutual consent with effect from this date of order. Decree be drawn accordingly.

A copy of this order and decree be supplied free of cost to both the parties under the provision as envisaged in Section 23(4) of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.
