

Mat Suit No. 583 of 2024

Order No. 12 dated 01.06.2026

Today is fixed for passing necessary order.

The petitioner is present by filing hazira.

On perusal of the record it appears that the petitioner has filed the present suit against her husband u/s 13 of Hindu Marriage Act for dissolution of their marriage. In spite of service of summons, the respondent has not appeared in this case and the suit is proceeded with on ex parte against him.

It is the contention of the petitioner that the marriage between the parties was solemnized on 25.01.2019 according to Hindu Rites and Customs and the respondent/husband started to reside at the house of the respondent at 275 B.B.D road, flat No.1 Tulshi Apartment, P.S. Uttarpara, District Hooghly. It is the allegation of the petitioner that in her matrimonial home she was subjected to torture by the respondent and his mother both physically and mentally on demand of dowry and ultimately she was compelled to leave her matrimonial home on 18.12.2022 and since then she is residing at her father's house.

In support of the contention of the petitioner, the petitioner has adduced evidence as P.W.1 and one Lal Chand Garg, the father of the petitioner has adduced evidence being P.W.2.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and on perusal of the record, it appears to me that the testimony of the petitioner regarding her contention remains unchallenged and there is nothing on record to contradict her contention.

Considering the above, it appears to me that the petitioner is able to prove her case and is entitled to get the relief as prayed for.

Hence, it is,

ORDERED

that the marriage took place in between the petitioner and the respondent on 25.01.2019 as per Hindu Rites and Customs is hereby dissolved by way of decree of divorce u/s 13(1)(ia) of Hindu Marriage Act.
