Abhay Singh vs. State of Punjab

ORDER:

1. Heard on the bail application moved by applicant **Abhay Singh**, under Section 483 BNSS.
2. Notice of the bail application was given to the State. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor put in appearance on behalf of the State and record Court was called for.
3. I have heard the learned Counsel for applicant/accused, Additional Public Prosecutor for the State and also perused the record with their able assistance.
4. It is submitted as well as argued by the applicant/accused as well as by his counsel that applicant/accused is an agriculturist having 14 bighas of land and he is married and having a child born about 06 months earlier and he has been falsely implicated in the present case. It is further submitted that no recovery in this case was effected from the applicant/accused when he was arrested from his house on 19.06.2026 after lapse of three months from the registration of present case and his name is not mentioned in the FIR. It is further submitted that recovery of 45Kg 950 Gms is shown to be effected from co-accused Ajay Kumar and

during police remand his confessional statement was recorded by the IO when the alleged recovery was shown to be effected from co-accused Ajay Kumar in this case. It is further submitted that the only evidence in this case against applicant/accused is confessional statement of co-accused Ajay Kumar and alleged recovery of 45 KG 950 Grams of poppy husk is non commercial quantity. It is further submitted that confessional statement of Ajay Kumar is not binding against the applicant/accused. It is further averred that applicant/accused shall abide by all the terms and conditions of the Court and shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court and shall not tamper with the prosecution evidence or the prosecution witnesses. With these averments, it is prayed that applicant/accused be released on bail.

5. On the other hand, learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State has vehemently argued that the allegations against the applicant/accused are grave in nature, so he does not deserve the concession of bail and prayed that bail application moved by applicant/accused may kindly be dismissed.

6. The brief facts of the case are that on 28.03.2026 ASI Lovedeep Singh along with police party were on patrolling duty in private vehicles near Bus Stand village Sangtiwala, when at about 11.15 A.M secret informer gave information that Pargat Singh was coming in XUV vehicle bearing registration No. DL-07-CM-7059 along with heavy quantity of poppy husk and that if naka is laid down, he can be apprehended red handed. Immediately, a car was seen by the police party

coming from Sular Gharat on the embankment of the canal, which stopped on seeing the police party and started turning back. The police party got on their private vehicles and moved towards the car and then started following the car which after crossing Sular Gharat, Gujran, Khanal Kalan, Dialgarh Jejian, Bassiarkh, Kahangarh entered village Naraingarh. When the police party was looking for this vehicle, they received secret information that this vehicle had entered the house of Rajinder Singh. Thereafter, report under Section 42 NDPS Act was sent to higher police officials and house of Rajinder Singh was searched and 128.660 KG poppy husk was recovered from car bearing registration No.DL-07-CM-7059. Accused Pargat Singh had fled away after parking his car in the house of Rajinder Singh. Thereafter, FIR was lodged and investigation was commenced. During investigation, it came out that the car in question belong to Ajay Kumar and further from the CCTV footage of the various Toll Tax barriers and bank statements of Pargat Singh and Ajay Kumar it came out that Ajay Kumar and Pargat Singh were together running a business of selling poppy husk and Ajay Kumar was thus nominated as an accused and subsequently arrested. When Ajay Kumar was arrested, from his car bearing registration No.DL-04-CAN-6062 Silver Honda City, 45.950 KG poppy husk was recovered. During questioning of Ajay Kumar, he disclosed that he was bringing the contraband from Madhya Pradesh from the bail applicant Abhay Singh and subsequently Abhay Singh was arrested.

7. In the case in hand, a huge quantity of contraband i.e. 128.660 Kilograms poppy husk and 45.950 Kilograms of Poppy husk has been recovered from the possession of co-accused and co-accused Ajay Singh has disclosed that he procured 45.950 Kilograms Poppy Husk from the bail applicant. Clearly, supply of contraband was being made by the bail applicant/accused in a planned manner. Further in the present case a huge quantity of contraband has been recovered. Accordingly the applicant is not entitled to be released on regular bail or interim bail at this stage. Therefore, the bail application is ordered to be dismissed. File be tagged with the remand papers.
