

State Vs. Vishal Verma & Ors.

Application for grant of regular bail u/s.480 BNSS filed on behalf of applicant/ accused Vishal Verma received duly marked by Ld. CJM (East) vide order dated 11.04.2026.

Present: Sh. Chetan Mittal, Ld. APP for State.
Sh. Ravi Kumar and Sh. Harshit Shishodia, Ld. counsels for accused.

Reply to the bail application filed. Same is taken on record.

It is stated in the application that the applicant/accused has been languishing in JC since 31.03.2026; that accused is innocent and has been falsely implicated in the present case; that the role of accused is strictly limited to his bank account being inadvertently used by the main accused; that accused has clean antecedents; that accused is the sole bread-winner of his family; that investigation qua accused is complete and his further custodial interrogation is no longer required and as such no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the accused behind the bars. It is further stated that accused is ready to abide by the terms & conditions as may be imposed by this court and to furnish reliable surety to the entire satisfaction of the court. Hence, it is prayed that the accused may be granted bail.

Ld. APP for the State has strongly opposed the bail application of the accused.

In the reply, the IO has also opposed the bail application stating that the allegations against the accused are serious in nature involving

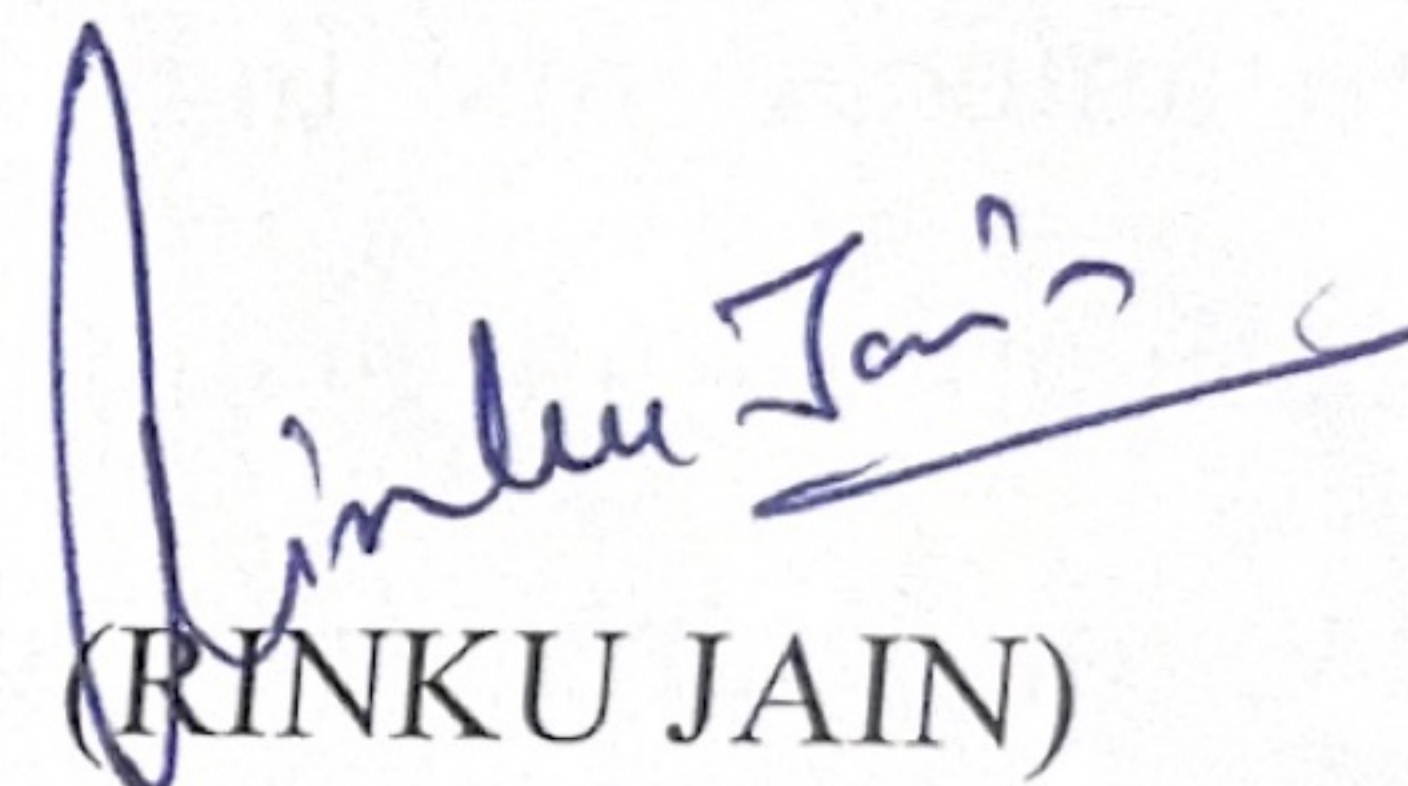
organized cyber fraud; that there is active involvement of accused in providing and arranging mule bank accounts. It is prayed that the accused may not be granted bail as there is every likelihood of accused tampering with evidence and absconding himself or assisting co-accused persons.

Considering the facts & circumstances of the case coupled with the fact that the investigation is at nascent stage, co-accused are yet to be arrested, seriousness of allegations levelled against the accused and the fact that there is a possibility of repetition of the offence, also that accused appears to be part of a larger organized cyber fraud syndicate, this court does not deem it fit to grant bail to the accused at this stage as it would adversely hamper the investigation. Accordingly, **bail application of accused Vishal Verma is dismissed.**

Bail application stands disposed of accordingly. Copy dasti.
